## Three Persons Hurt In Auto Accident

### One Hospitalized Following Accident

Three persons were injured in a traffic accident Saturday, one of them seriously enough to remain in the Adams county memorial hospital though attaches there state his condition is "good."

The three were rushed to the hospital from the scene just this side of the Ohio state line on U. S. 224 where a car driven by James Roy, of route 1, Monroeville, failed to negotiate the curve.

The accident was investigated

by state trooper Bob Mercer, who stated that Roy apparently approached the curve at a high rate of speed, lost control of the car which uprooted a tree and a stretch of fence along the highway.

Margaret Roeger, of Fort Wayne, a passenger in the car, suffered lacerations of the legs and arms, and Joe Clem, also of route 1, Monroeville, suffered head injuries.

Roy suffered severe lacerations of the face and wrists, and underwent surgery. Mercer stated that the 1949 Ford was completely demolished.

## 14 Persons Killed On State Highways

### Largest Violent Toll Of October

Weekend Indiana traffic accidents claimed 14 lives, the biggest violent death toll of the month, and a 15th person died of injuries suffered earlier in the week.

Dense fog shrouded many Hoosier highways Sunday evening, making homeward trips from weekend visits hazardous. Police attributed at least one fatal accident to the fog.

Authorities said three cars collided at a fogged intersection on U. S. 32 northwest of Indianapolis. Killed in the crash was Mrs. Florence Devault, 70, Indianapolis.

Two persons were killed Sunday when a car struck a truck on Ind. 46 south of Terre Haute. The victims, both of west Terre Haute, were Ora Wilson, 38, and Mrs. Geneva Auterson, 32.

Neal Patrick Marchessault, 24, Elkhart, was killed Sunday night when he lost control of his motorcycle on a curve near Elkhart. Police said the motorcycle started skidding just north of the Michigan-Indiana state line and Marchessault was thrown from the cycle and landed on the Indiana side of the line.

Edwin Foster, 17, Huntington, was killed early Sunday when the car in which he was riding collided with another vehicle on Ind. 5 near Huntington, and Earl Hicks, 20, New Castle, was killed Saturday night in an auto-trailer collision on U. S. 40 near Centerville.

Eight persons died in Saturday accidents. The victims included Kenneth Edwards, 19-year-old Gary sailor, who was killed in a three-car collision in Gary, and Joseph D. Garrison, 60, Hammond, who walk-

ed into the path of a Pennsylvania passenger train at East Chicago and was killed.

A bride of two months, Mrs. Mary Davis, 21, Indianapolis, died Saturday soon after a car driven by her husband swerved out of control on Ind. 29 northwest of Indianapolis and struck a utility pole.

Two boys died Saturday of injuries suffered when they were hit by cars. The victims were George Ray Murphy, 6, Otisco, who was injured Wednesday, and Marvin Ziegler, 4, Dubois, hurt Saturday.

John Garver, 92, Argos, was killed in a two-car collision on U. S. 31 near Argos, and Walter G. Anderson, 55, Louisville, Ky., was killed when his truck struck a bridge abutment on Ind. 62 near Boonville.

## Pranksters Move City Limits Of Berne Two Miles

The matter of the expansion of the city of Berne, one of the most hotly disputed topics of the day in that vicinity was quietly but assuredly settled over the weekend.






