

## Decatur Young Men To Enter Ministry

### Two Presbyterian Youths Plan Study

"We have invested, for the past half century," the Rev. A. C. E. Gillander told the congregation at First Presbyterian church Sunday, "our best brainpower as well as our material resources in the interesting tangible knowledge of science. Mechanical science has brought us many additions to comfortable living on earth, but no greater skill in the art of living together. We are now horribly aware that moral, ethical, and spiritual knowledge has not kept pace with our mechanics. And

with that awareness comes the purpose to invest the best of our leadership, and thinking in the studies which will best enable man to find harmony with his God and his fellow men.

"Our own local church is making a healthy start in the needed direction," the pastor continued. "Two of our young men of outstanding possibilities have declared themselves as candidates for the gospel ministry. We as a congregation have the privilege of aiding Robert Hansel and Paris Franz in their preparation for the ministry, and thus making investments which can pay off in dividends of peace and good will to men. A fund to aid these two young men and to encourage other young people to enter full time Christian service is our great opportunity for the second half of this Twentieth Century."

It was suggested that Roscoe Glendening, Christian Education treasurer of the church, should handle the "Full-time Christian service fund" as a separate account.

Robert Hansel, whose parents formerly resided here, has already been received under the care of Fort Wayne Presbytery as a candidate for the ministry. Hansel is a sophomore at Franklin College, and plans to enter McCormick Theological Seminary upon graduation. His parents now reside in Lancaster, Ohio. The student assisted Rev. Gillander in the worship service last Sunday.

Paris Franz, son of Mrs. Franklin Franz of 313 Adams street, will be received as a candidate for the ministry at the next meeting of Fort Wayne Presbytery, February 6. Franz has about a year more of college work before entering seminary. He is studying at present at Indiana University extension, Fort Wayne. He will assist his pastor in the worship next Sunday.

On Youth Sunday, January 28, it is planned that Hansel and Franz conduct the worship service in entirety.

session grant the rest of the president's request—authority to reshuffle executive agencies for defense purposes.

The senate pushed through the civil defense bill to voice vote after half an hour of debate during which chairman Pat McCarran, D., Nev., of the judiciary committee called it a menace to American liberties.

McCarran objected to an emergency provision, operative only if the president or congress declared a state of civil defense emergency, would suspend the administrative procedures, act which

curbs the conduct of government agencies.

In event of an attack or the imminent threat of an attack the civil defense administrator could requisition property needed to aid sickened or endangered areas, spend any sum for such aid, and require other agencies to help civil defense efforts.


