Funeral Services Tuesday Afternoon

Mrs. Mary Fox, 76, a lifelong resident of Adams county, died at 10 a.m. Sunday at the home of a daughter, Mrs. David Reinhart, northwest of Berne. She had been bedfast since suffering a stroke five years ago.

Born in French township April 28, 1874, she was a daughter of Cliff and Elizabeth Mossler-Yoder. Her husband, Fred Fox, died several months ago.

She was a member of the Cross Evangelical and Reformed church at Berne.

Surviving in addition to the daughter are a grandson; two brothers, Sam Yoder of Geneva route 1 and Jonas Yoder of Wauseon, O., and a sister, Mrs. Chris Roth of Fort Wayne.

Seed Quality Oats Supply Is Sought

The county extension office would like to know who has a supply of Clinton 59 or Benton oats of seed quality. County agent L. E. Archbold states he would like to have farmers write or phone this information to him as soon as a germination test has been run by the owner. He further states that the extension office is not interested in lots of Nemaha, Ajax, Beaver, Larain, or Exeter. Repeated field trials in Indiana have shown that they are unadapted.

Clinton 59 and Benton oats have consistently out-yielded them with a higher test weight.

Germination test are easy to make by placing 100 grains of oats between blotting paper, then place the paper in a dish and keep wet. Keep germination sample at a good growing temperature.
