Drug Once Used To Kill, Now Helpful To Man

MODERN anesthetics have found new uses for curare, the arrow-tip poison of South American Indians. Hundreds of years ago these Indians learned to dip their arrows in poisons made from the juice of certain herbs. These arrows brought paralysis and quick death to game animals and tribal enemies. Scientists have long sought some useful purpose for this deadly poison. Within the last ten years they have learned how to use it to relax the muscles.

A common expression in surgery of the abdomen is that the patient was "inadequately relaxed." This means that his abdominal muscles were too tense, making the operation extremely difficult. Many times "inadequate relaxation" has been the cause of a long-drawn-out operation. At other times the operation could not be completed, or was completed without the proper results. This, in turn, has led to complications from surgery and long hospital stays for numerous patients.

The anesthetic can now use curare and similar drugs to prevent many of these conditions. When the abdominal muscles are over-tense, a carefully measured amount of the drug is injected into a vein. This relaxes the muscles and makes surgery much easier.

However, the curare also acts to paralyze the muscles used in breathing. A highly-trained anesthetist must always watch the patient's breathing closely while the drug is being used, and must sometimes control the breathing
