Dodgers Score 15 In First To Whip Reds

New York, May 22 — (UP) — It was Ladies' day in Brooklyn today, but Ebbets field is no place right now for women or children.

The Dodgers are likely to frighten away all but the brave-hearted if they come even close to repeating last night's record-breaking, 19 to 1, massacre of Cincinnati.

Taking out after the Reds like they were the ones from Korea, Brooklyn scored 15 runs in the first inning, setting five new major league records in the process. The 15 runs were an all-time modern high, as were the 21 men to come to bat in a single inning. The 15 runs-batted-in also was tops. The 19 men who got on base safely put another entry into the books, and the fact that 12 men scored after two were out provided the fifth new mark.

Moving into first place undisputedly ahead of the Giants as they broke out of a prolonged hitting slump against four shell-shocked Cincy pitchers, the Dodgers made 10 hits in the inning, drew seven walks, and two batters were hit by pitches. Duke Snider touched it all off with a two-run homer and catcher Rube Walker drove in three runs with two hits. Pee-wee Reese, Andy Pafko, and pitcher Chris Van Cuyk drove in two runs apiece in the amazing rally.

Van Cuyk, whose five-hit pitching was completely overshadowed by the other events, was also the mightiest Dodger at bat, collecting four straight singles. That was astonishing, in view of the fact that he had gotten only three previous hits in his major league career. He got two in the first inning and in the third and fifth after he singled. Bobby Morgan followed each time with a homer. Homer Howell spoiled Van Cuyk's "shutout" with a home run—his first hit of the year.

The Giants fell half a game off the pace, by dividing their day-night doubleheader with the Cardinals. They won the night game, 8 to 1, on the steady pitching of Dave Koslo, who beat the Cardinals for the 10th straight time since 1950. But Cliff Chambers held them to four hits to win the afternoon contest, 3 to 0. Del Rice hit a Cardinal homer while Davey Williams got one for the Giants in the night contest.

In the other National league game, Robin Roberts of the Phillies won his seventh in a row, 7 to 3, against the Pirates. Chicago at Boston was rained out. In the American league, Cleveland went three full games in front of Washington by defeating the Red Sox, 5 to 1, while the Browns topped the Senators, 2 to 1 in 10 innings. The Yankees made it four straight over Chicago, winning 5 to 1, and Virgil Trucks pitched 6 1-3 innings of no-hit ball on top of his no-hitter the last time out, to give Detroit a two-hit, 5 to 1 win over the Athletics.

Paris Riot Police Altered For Riots

Reds To Protest Ridgway Arrival

Paris, May 22. — (UP) — Some 15,000 riot police were alerted today as the Communists ordered five days of demonstrations against Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway, beginning tomorrow.

The Reds were caught off balance when NATO headquarters announced the new allied commander will arrive on Tuesday. Communist leaders who had expected Ridgway tomorrow issued orders to let the scheduled weekend demonstrations go ahead and continue into next week.

Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower was scheduled to say farewell to the central front headquarters of his command at Fontainebleau tomorrow when the Communists will be hitting the streets here.

City authorities ordered police to mass at strategic points, ready to move to any place where violence threatens.

Communist demonstrations were ordered in eight key locations in Paris and the city's suburbs after factories close tomorrow. The party appealed to followers throughout the country to sound their opposition to the arrival of "general plague," as the Reds call Ridgway to point up their charges that he ordered germ warfare.

The Reds also called for flash strikes in some industrial plants. Red propaganda cut loose with new fury and buildings were painted with "U.S. go home."

La Motta In Easy Win Over Hairston

Detroit, May 22 — (UP) — Burly Jake La Motta, who left a sick bed to defeat Eugene (Silent) Hairston, turned his eyes to England today and a possible match with Randy Turpin, the king of British empire middleweights.

The 30-year-old La Motta said after taking an easy, unanimous 10-round decision from Hairston before 10,233 Olympia stadium fans last night, that he was sick all last week with a stomach ailment but didn't consider calling off the fight.

Jake now is in a strange situation. James D. Norris, president of the international boxing club, has promised him a crack at the light heavyweight title. However, La Motta must wait until Joey Maxim and Ray Robinson, present middleweight champion, meet next month to decide who will wear the light heavy crown.

La Motta said regardless of the Maxim-Robinson outcome, that he would take on whichever fighter the IBC chooses—which might be Robinson in an over-weight match if Maxim retains his championship.

There was no doubt La Motta who scaled 168, defeated Hairston. Judge Jack Asperly favored Jake 55-45. Judge Joseph Lenahan liked him 52-48 and Referee Clarence Rosen gave him a 53-47 edge. There were no knockdowns in the fight.

Hearing Is Held On Fox Open Season

Indianapolis, May 22. — (UP) — A public hearing to determine the 1952 open season on fox and grey squirrels was held by the Indiana department of conservation.

An original hearing date was set for May 19, but inclement weather prevented adequate attendance, Kenneth M. Kunkel, director of the Indiana department of conservation said.

The department proposed that the 1952 open season be from August 16 to Oct. 15, inclusive. This is two days earlier than the 1951 season.

Complete Training In Plant Protection




