Benson Again Hits Rigid Price Support

Only One Opponent Found By Secretary

OMAHA, UP — Secretary of agriculture Ezra Taft Benson said he turned up only one opponent of administration farm policies during a midwest speaking tour which he now has completed. He returns to Washington today.

Benson told the Nebraska Farmers Union convention Wednesday night that high rigid crop support program "is not working" and cannot "be made to work in a peacetime economy."

Benson, who earlier addressed a Chamber of Commerce farmer-businessman meeting in Columbus, Neb., said he was encouraged by the attitude of midwestern farmers toward the flexible price support program recommended by President Eisenhower.

He said he found only one dissenter, a woman, who expressed opposition to the program during his current midwest tour.

The secretary reiterated Wednesday night that rigid price supports are not the answer to the farmer's problems.

He said "acreage controls infringe upon the basic rights of farmers," and that rigid price supports are "opposed to the principle of supply and demand."

Although the National Farmers Union has frequently opposed Benson and has been one of his sharpest critics, the secretary was on more friendly ground here. When asked how it felt to talk to "friendly" farmers, Benson replied, "they are all friendly."

Benson said "something on dairy price supports" would be announced within a few days.

"Let's not sit idly in a leaky boat, waiting for it to sink," Benson told the Farmers union. "Surely it is crystal clear that the present price support program is not protecting farm income and farm prices."

Seek Racing Yacht With Four Aboard

LONG BEACH, Calif. UP — An Air Force plane today joined the search for a racing yacht with four persons aboard, missing since Monday when it radioed it was taking water in heavy Pacific seas.

A Navy patrol boat, the ROCS 838, searched in vain for 24 hours Wednesday in the area in which the schooner Dirigo II last reported its position—300 miles south of Acapulco, Mex., and 180 miles off the coast.

told the congressional economic committee he expects farm prices and income to be about the same this year as last. That is, he added, "providing abnormal developments in weather or in the economy as a whole do not occur."

Housing: Chairman Jesse P. Wolcott, R-Mich., of the house banking committee conferred with President Eisenhower on housing. He said they were in "general agreement." He declined to say, however, whether he supports Mr. Eisenhower's proposal to start 35,000 public housing units in the fiscal year starting July 1.

Communist: Rep. Martin Dies, D-Tex., asked President Eisenhower and Republican and Democratic leaders to support a bill he has introduced to outlaw Communists. He said in a letter to the President and others that the issue "must never be permitted to become partisan." His bill would make it a crime to belong to any groups that "believe in, advise, advocate or teach Communism."

French patrols clashed with Red advance units patrolling in search of a weak spot in its defense perimeter.

The spokesman said the Communists, who seldom fight in the open, may turn against secondary objectives in the area rather than risk a direct attack on Luang Prabang.

He said the situation at the moment is "vague," and the French are sending out patrols to try to determine what the Reds intend to do next.

In Vientiane, Laos, real center of government, Crown Prince Si Vang Vatthara said some 13,000 native troops among the defenders of Luang Prabang are "ready for the struggle." He said their morale is "excellent."

A number of incidents were reported elsewhere in Indochina during the day.

French troops who Wednesday abandoned Kontum, in the southeast central part of the country, under Communist pressure were reported falling back on Pleiku, some 80 miles north of Emperor Bao Dai's residence.

In southern Laos, near the border of Cambodia, a small native force abandoned the outpost of Houei Khone to the Communists. Cambodian Defense Minister Khin Tiri said he believes Red operations in the border area represent "no immediate danger" to Cambodia.

Reds Seek To Prevent East German Revolt

Special Security Squads Set Up By Communist Police

BERLIN, UP — The Communists have set up special security squads against possible farmer revolt in East Germany, anti-Red sources said today.

The anti-Communist Information Bureau West said the Reds have arrested at least 14 of their own police officers and 30 more students, accused of supporting the West's proposal for free all-German elections.

The police, this source said, were charged with espionage for the West and "undermining the morale of the police" by listening to, and spreading reports of Western broadcasts of the Berlin foreign ministers conference.

At the same time, the U. S. high commission newspaper Neue Zeitung reported that new "protest actions" by discontented industrial workers flared in parts of the Soviet zone within the past 48 hours.

Both moves were reported as part of the continually growing unrest among East Germans against Russia's refusal to unify Germany.

The Neue Zeitung said East Berlin factory workers distributed leaflets demanding free elections and attacking Soviet foreign minister V. M. Molotov's plan for a plebiscite on unity or the European defense community.

The newspaper said that in the Oberschoeneweide factory workers shouted down Communist Party Central committee member Paul Wandel, who was sent to the plant to speak on the Soviet union plan.

When Wandel said that if the workers did not like his speech they could leave, the Neue Zeitung said most walked out.

Other sources said, meanwhile, that the Reds now regard the farmers as potentially more dangerous than the factory workers who revolted last June.
