Calls For Probe

WASHINGTON, UP — Sen. Clinton P. Anderson today called for a "full-scale" investigation of the dairy price support situation to find "the best possible answer in the interests of all."

The New Mexico Democrat, a former secretary of agriculture, joined chairman George D. Aiken (R-Vt.) of the senate agriculture committee in introducing legislation to extend price supports to

whole milk as well as butter and other processed dairy products.

The measure would also permit dairy price supports to be geared to the price of feed grains.

Anderson spoke out just one day before current dairy price supports are to drop from 90 to 75 percent of "fair price" parity under an order by agriculture secretary Ezra T. Benson. Many farm state congressmen and dairymen have bitterly opposed the price

prop cut.

Anderson said he did not "necessarily favor" all parts of the new bill. But he said it would serve as a springboard for complete hearings on the dairy issue.

Reports Certified
Soybean Seed Scarce

"Where can I get Lincoln, Hawkeye, or Harosoy soybean seed of good germination?" is a question asked frequently in the county extension office, states county agent L. E. Archbold. As nearby sources of certified soybean seed are nearly exhausted, Archbold suggests that soybeans in farm storage be tested for germination. He would like to have the names and addresses of farmers having Lincoln, Hawkeye, or Harosoy seed that germinates 75% or better. This information together with the number of bushels on hand is important because: (1) Much of the seed beans of the last harvest lost germination by being handled too dry. (2) There is likely to be a large acreage of beans planted, if seed can be found.

Hoosier Pilot Is

Lauded For Heroism

Dead Pilot Sought
To Prevent Crash

PORT BRAGG, N. C. UP — An Indiana pilot whose C-119 Flying Boxcar crashed into a mess hall, killing him and six other persons, was praised today for heroism because of his efforts to avert the accident.

First Lt. Albert W. Parks, 25, Cannelton, Ind., did a "heroic thing" in trying to set his listing plane down on the 400-yard long parade ground, said Lt. Col. B. A. Katz, an eyewitness.

Ten persons were injured in the accident.

The giant troop-and-cargo carrying plane smashed into a mess hall in a crowded troop area here Tuesday while the pilot was fighting to bring the craft in on a narrow parade ground.

Flames exploded from the wreckage, keeping rescue workers at bay for almost two hours while firemen fought the raging fire.

The pilot and one of the three other crewmen aboard were killed. Three of five army passengers in the plane and two of the seven men in the mess hall at the time died.

Authorities planned to sift the debris again today, but said they did not expect to find any more victims.

The Boxcar, crippled by a burning engine, roared over the troop area, known as "Smoke Bomb Hill," about 10 a.m. EST, clipped the top of a bachelors officers' quarters tearing loose its tail section, gilded over the parade field, then skidded about 100 feet into the mess hall.

Officers said that two hours later, the mess hall would have been packed by some 200 men eating lunch. As it was, only seven men, cooks and soldiers on KP, were in the building at the time.

NOBLESVILLE, Ind., UP — Jerry Whicker, 12, Sheridan, died in Riverview hospital Tuesday night, the sixth victim of one of Indiana's worst traffic accidents in months.

The boy was injured Sunday when two autos collided in Ind. 38 near Sheridan during a rain and windstorm occurring about the time Anderson was hit by a tornado 30 miles east of the accident scene.

Four occupants of the two cars were killed outright and a fifth died Monday. The boy's death left no survivors in the head-on crash.

He said the condition of these fishermen was somewhat unclear because American doctors had not been permitted to make "proper clinical examination" of them.

4. He said reports concerning widespread contamination of tuna and other fish did not conform to the facts of the situation. He said the only contaminated fish found were in the open hold of the Fortunate Dragon, and the U. S. food and drug administration inspectors found no instance of radioactivity in any other fish shipments.




