Decided Farm Price Drop In September

Seven Percent Drop Reported In State

LAFAYETTE, Ind. (INS) — Purdue university reported today that Indiana farmers received seven percent less for their products in September than they did in August.

The September index, the lowest since April 1950, was 241, compared to 260 in August, and was 12 percent below that of a year ago.

The buying power of Indiana farm products likewise dropped six percent from August to September.

Major decreases in products prices were: Soybeans, 25 percent; potatoes, 21 percent; hogs, 12 percent; chickens, 10 percent; eggs, nine percent; lambs, eight percent, and turkeys, seven percent.

The few increases were apples, 28 percent; milk, seven percent, and oats, six percent.

Nearly all livestock feeding ratio fell below the long-time average for the first time since January, 1953.

3. Leo Corrigan, a Dallas builder who bought two Washington-area FHA apartment projects in 1947, testified he and a partner put up only \$10,000 to swing their \$43,800,000 purchase deal, and paid two and one-half percent instead of the usual four percent of the mortgage for the balance.

Committee counsel William Simon read to Andrews a series of cases in which builders cut multimillion dollar melons after making shoe-string investments, and paid little or no taxes. He asked whether "something can be done about it."

Andrews replied: "We think there are aspects of all these cases that at least give us better than a fighting chance to get at these situations and we intend to go after them."

Andrews said the windfall profiteers undoubtedly believed they could escape through loopholes in the tax laws. But he pointed out that ways have been found to plug many of these supposed loopholes.

The commissioner said there are more than 1,150 cases involving federal housing administration projects in which the government will move to collect the full income tax rates on windfall profits, although the project promoters have claimed that the lower, 25 percent capital gains tax applies for them.
