

Farmers Must Sign To Receive Payment

Feb. 28 Deadline On Soil Practices

Farmers who want the government to pay part of the cost of their conservation improvements this year must sign up at ASC (formerly PMA and AAA) office before February 28. Oscar T.

Brown, chairman for Adams county, said today.

Farmers may sign their requests during office hours, which are from 8 a.m. until 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. The office is closed all day Saturday.

Brown stated that farmers requesting cost-sharing must stay within the corn and wheat allotments during 1955 on all farms in which they have an interest. Also, the request must be made before the practice is started.

The following are approved for

this county: installing drainage tiles; constructing open ditches, installing pipelines for livestock water; constructing ponds, dams, pits, or wells for livestock water; permanent sod waterways, terraces, and diversion terraces; limestone applied to legumes (beans, etc.); and many others. For more details, farmers are urged to call at the county ASC office in the Niblick building at the corner of Second and Monroe streets in Decatur.
