## Automatic Street Sweeper Displayed

City officials were given a demonstration today of a new, modern completely automatic street sweeper. The machine, which is self-propelled, carries a suction tank which holds three cubic yards of dirt.

Brushes are about the only wearing part on the machine. Completely automatic, the sweeper can be operated by one man. Use of it would materially cut down the number of men needed in the street cleaning department. An Indianapolis concern had charge of the demonstration.

## Carmen Basilio Is Winner By Decision

NEW YORK (INS) — Carmen Basilio may want a crack at Bobo Olson's middleweight title but he'll need a few more tune-ups before he can even risk his own welterweight crown.

The Canastota, N. Y. elouter scored a unanimous ten round, non title decision over Italo Scorticini of Italy at Madison Square Garden Wednesday night in his first start since winning the title June 10 from Tony De Marco.

But Carmen was so weary during the tenth round that he did some clock watching. He also required a few stitches under the right eye from a cut opened in the 10th round by the light punching Italo. Basilio was gashed in the left eyebrow in the ninth and Scorticini suffered a wound atop his head in the third.

Basilio announced before the nationally televised (ABC) match that he intends to challenge for Olson's title.

"I'd like to get the opportunity before Ray Robinson beats me to it," Basilio said, "because I think that the first good man to meet Olson for his title will defeat him."

## Nixon To Make Two Speeches In State

INDIANAPOLIS (INS) — When Vice President Richard M. Nixon comes to Indiana Sept. 17 to address a plowing contest, Indiana GOP leaders expect him to remain to reap a sizeable kitty for the Hoosier Republican party.

Nixon earlier had agreed to address the national plowing contest at Wabash on that date. The Indiana Republican headquarters confirmed late Tuesday that he will come to Indianapolis after the Wabash address and make a second talk at a \$100 a plate fund raising banquet.

## World's Richest Golf Meet Opens

CHICAGO (INS) — The lure of a \$50,000 first place jackpot drew 105 of the world's outstanding male golfers to Chicago's Tam O'Shanter Country club today for the opening round of the richest tournament ever staged.

The annual chase for the pot of gold in the ninth world tournament of golf got underway shortly after dawn and the fairways were expected to be crowded with players until late in the evening.

Golfers from 21 countries are competing for the gigantic jackpot, and an additional \$57,000 in tournament tours that goes to the eventual winner.

A total of \$17,000 in prizes will be distributed to the finishers in the men's and women's ranks in both pro and amateur divisions.

Doug Ford of Kiamasha Lake, N. Y., has been conceded the favorite's role in the 72 hole tourney by virtue of his brilliant play the past three weeks.

The 33-year-old one time amateur baseball player, however, will be swinging against the biggest names in golf-American and foreign. Only batam Ben Hogan's and Bobby Locke's names failed to appear on the list of entries.

Included in the male ranks are Cary Middlecoff of Kiamasha Lake, Roberto de Vicenzo of Mexico City and Jack Fleck, the U. S. Open titlist who failed to qualify after the halfway mark of the All-American.

In the women's pro ranks, Patty Berg of St. Andrews, Ill., will defend her world title.

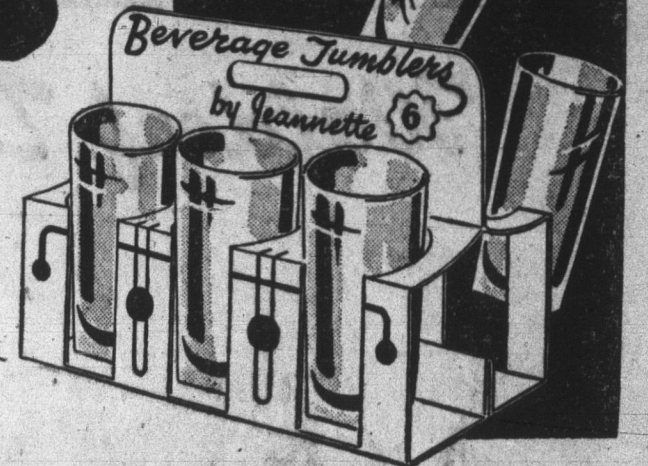

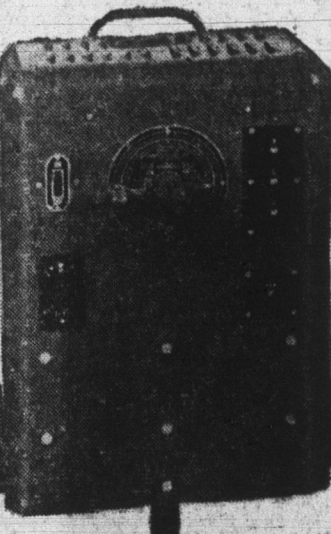
