Woman To Study Slaying Suspects

Believed Last To
See Scout Alive

MUSKEGON, Mich. (INS) — Authorities today pinned their hopes of finding Peter Gorbham's killer on a woman who may have been the last person to see him alive.
Mrs. Elsie Farrell lives near the heavily wooded area where the 12-year-old Evanston, Ill., Boy Scout was found last Sunday, shot through the head.
Mrs. Farrell saw a boy answering Peter's description talking to a man in a blue sedan on July 5, the day the youngster vanished while on a hike from a Boy Scout camp in Muskegon county.
State police were to have Mrs. Farrell view all those questioned

The storm's "eye" passed over Wilmington at 5:20 a. m. EST, and at 7 a. m. was a short distance north northwest of the city, moving toward the north northwest at 15 mph.

Highest winds at Wilmington were clocked at 74 miles per hour, but gusts up to 95 mph were felt earlier at Southport, N. C., a short distance to the south.

No injuries were reported as the eye passed inland only a short distance south of where hurricane Connie last Friday struck, to leave 49 dead and untold millions of property damage before she blew herself out in the northeastern states.

The boardwalk at Carolina Beach was damaged by wind and water but otherwise first reports of wind damage in the Wilmington area were confined to breaking tree limbs and window glass, and disrupted utilities.

Water damage was heavy, however, as the seas swept over low lying beaches where cottages were left unprotected in many cases when Connie washed away guardian sand dunes.

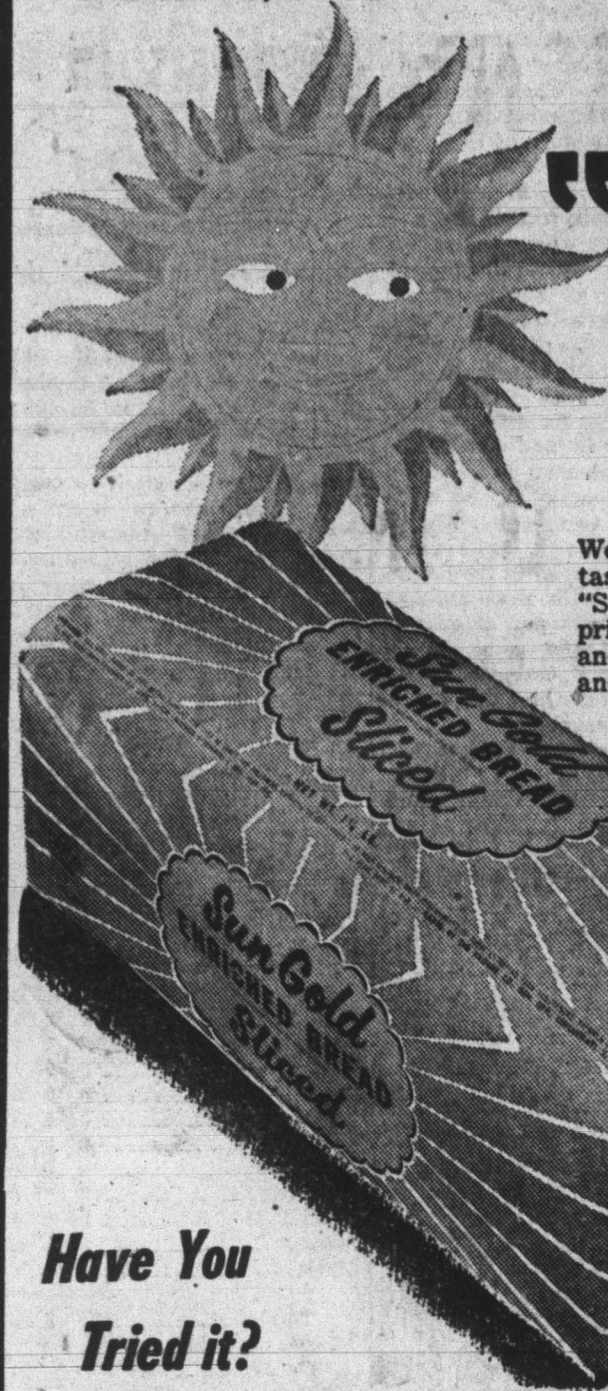

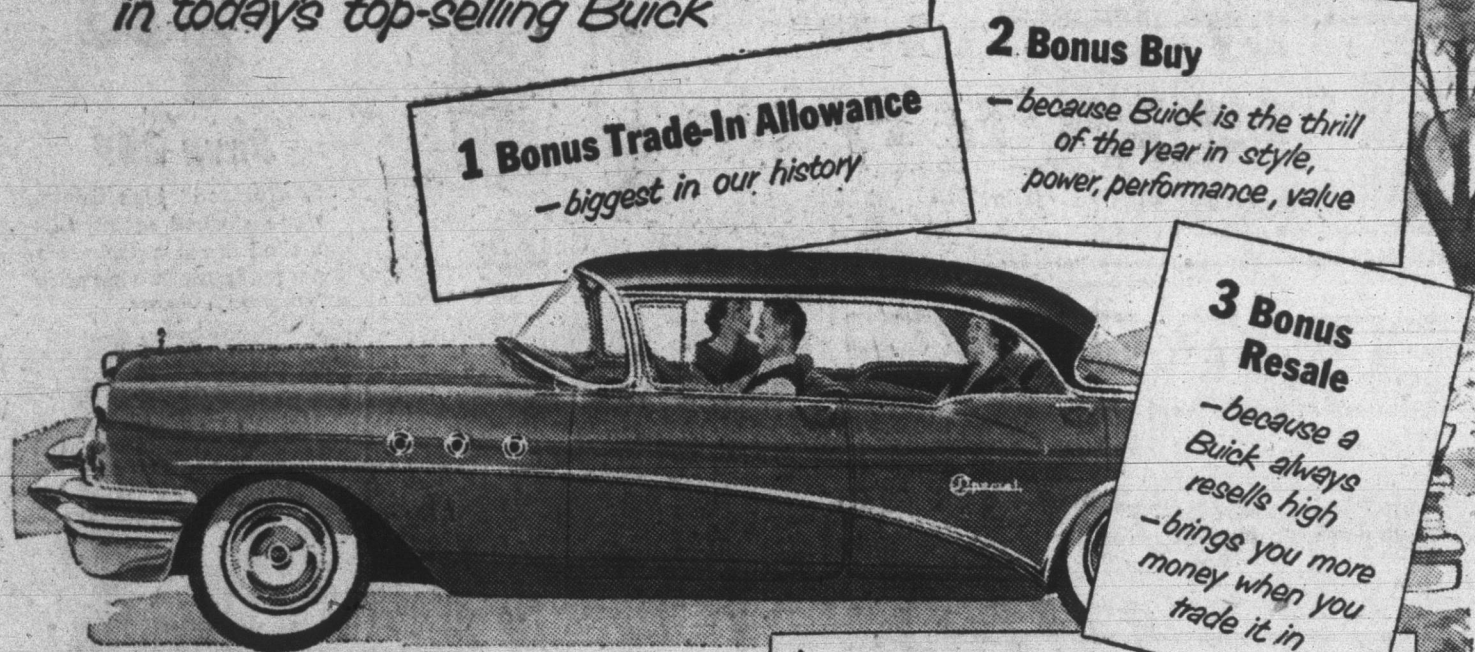
