## Cooler Weather Is Welcomed In State Soaking Rainfall In Portions Of State

INDIANAPOLIS (INS) — South Bend and Monticello got soaking rains and other parts of northwestern Indiana had lesser downfalls as a break to cooler weather was heralded.

The U. S. weather bureau, which had alerted the northwestern portion of the state for possible tornado peril, reported the state escaped unscathed.

Near normal temperatures for the next five days were forecast with the normal maximum being 81 in the north and 86 in the south. This is a considerable drop from the high of 91 reported Monday by South Bend and 96 at Evansville.

Normal minimums for the next five days were predicted at 58 north to 63 south. Only about a quarter inch of rain is expected, in the form of very widely scattered showers about Friday.

A gradual warming is antic-

ipated, beginning Saturday. Temperatures are expected to be in the lower 80s.  
South Bend was deluged with 2.24 inches of rain Monday, and Monticello had 1.06 inches. Other cities reporting to the U. S. weather bureau had amounts under an inch. Included were .83 at Warsaw, .75 at Rochester and .43 at Lafayette.
