Query Peru Couple In Infants' Deaths

Peru Woman, Uncle Grilled By Police

PERU, Ind. (INS) — Police today grilled a 23-year-old woman and the 35-year-old uncle she said fathered her four children, three of whom she burned in a trash pile.

The fourth child is reported in critical condition at Riley Hospital in Indianapolis.

It was birth of the premature child Oct. 11 in Dukes memorial hospital at Peru and belief by a physician that the woman had given birth before that led to the investigation.

Authorities said after questioning the woman admitted giving birth to sons in June, 1951; March, 1953, and July, 1954, in her uncle's home at Peru, where she lived with the

uncle and aunt. She named the uncle as the father of all four children.

In the statement she added that she gave birth to the first three unattended, wrapped their bodies in towels and disposed of them by burning them on a trash pile.

Names were not revealed pending filing of charges.

Cab Driver Rescues Woman From Creek

INDIANAPOLIS (INS) — Cab driver Calvin Randall, 28, of Indianapolis, leaped into Fall Creek over a submerged car and rescued Lucille Chappelle from the ice cold water.

Miss Chappelle lost control of her car on the bridge leading into the intersection after sideswiping a car driven by Richard Taylor, 28, also of Indianapolis. Her car rolled over an embankment and into the creek.

She was hauled into court today and charged with drunkenness.

Urge Tattooing To Show Blood Type

CHICAGO (INS) — Dr. Frank B. Beery, of Washington, assistant secretary of defense, has urged universal tattooing of every person to indicate his blood type.

He told the 41st clinical Congress of the American College of Surgeons in Chicago Thursday that tattooing is necessary to insure proper treatment, including transfusions of the injured, or in the event of widespread disasters.


