Our Lady of Fatima study club will meet Monday evening at 8 o'clock at the home of Mrs. Dale Morrissey.

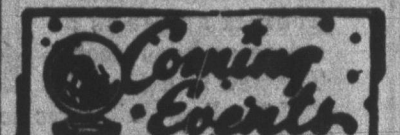

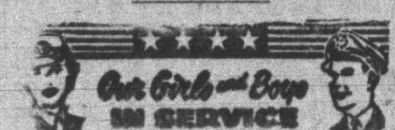
