Creamed Comments On S.A. Lesson

Creamed Comments on the Sunday School Lesson. The Grounds of Christian Assurance, 1 John 3:19-24; 4:14, for Sunday, August 19. —The Rev. D. Carl Yoder.

After the death of the apostles who spoke with authority, there arose so-called Christian teachers who assumed undue authority and injected false teachings into the church. This resulted in a loss of Christian faith, a toleration of un-Christian conduct. To overcome this situation, John wrote epistles to the churches, presenting the significant facts regarding Christ, and the promised victory to those who abide in Christ and have his Spirit.

V. 19. "And hereby we know that we are of the truth and shall assure our hearts before him." John speaks with positive knowledge; he was the last of the apostles. Christian faith leaves no place for doubt, and so he says, "we know." John includes the other disciples' testimony in the word "we." The power of God is revealed in truth which is invincible.

V. 20. "For it our heart condemn us, God is greater than our hearts and knoweth all things." As Christians who have truly repented of our sins, we have faith in God's forgiveness, for He is all-wise and has cancelled out all our sins.

V. 21. "Beloved, if our hearts condemn us not, then have we confidence toward God." In the word "Beloved" John addresses the recognized children of God. These have fully surrendered their sins for pardon and themselves for service and have an experience of confidence. Here is Christian assurance.

V. 22. "And whatsoever we ask, we receive of him, because we keep his commandments, and do those things pleasing in his sight." Assurance of answered prayer marks a true child of God, who first of all keeps the commandments wherein is provided the condition for answered prayer.

V. 23. "And this is his commandment, That we should believe on the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, and love one another as he gave us commandment." Note that commandment is in the singular number. When the Lord Jesus Christ possesses a life, then all commandments will be voluntarily kept, and among them is love for one another. Christ is the answer to every problem, then and now. Sheldon's book, "In His Steps" or "What Would Jesus do?" exemplifies this fact.

V. 24. "And he that keepeth his commandments dwelleth in him and he in him. And hereby we know that he abideth in us, by the Spirit which he hath given us." One may be the home of God and God may be the home of man. Here is the deepest Christian fellowship and holy communion. The Holy Spirit is the One, the third person of the Trinity, who does the introducing, in the enlightening, and the stabilizing. This deep experience in the enlightening, and the stabilizing, God, Christ and the Spirit.

V. 1. "Beloved, believe not every spirit, but try the spirits whether they be of God, because many false prophets have gone out into the world." False prophets are the professional Christian teachers that try to make important what is not Christian. All Christians are to be discerners of truth. Some doctrines are unduly emphasized; often an apparent truth does not fit into the whole harmony of truth; too often

the central teachings of Christ are minimized. We are commanded to search the Scriptures.

V. 2. "Hereby know ye the Spirit of God: every spirit that confesseth that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh from God." The incarnation of Jesus is the central concept; thus it is that the Holy Spirit reveals Jesus. When one receives the Spirit, he will also receive the Christ, the Son of man and the Son of God. The truths of this verse are accentuated in the next verse.

V. 4. "Ye are of God, little children, and have overcome them; because greater is he that is in you, than he that is in the world." The spiritual force let loose from God is greater than the physical forces let loose by man. That truth may well be applied to today's world situation.

V. 5. "They are of the world; therefore, speak they of the world, and the world heareth them not." False prophets fall because what they teach lacks spiritual appeal.

V. 6. "We are of God; and he that knoweth God heareth us. Hereby know we the spirit of truth and the spirit of error." Character is known by perceiving whose teachings they accept.
