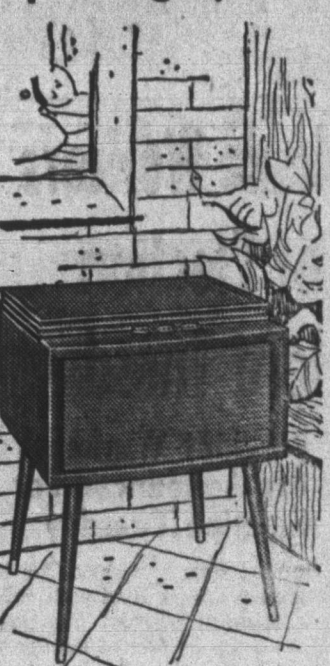
James Staley Named To Legion Committee
