MANDAMUS

State law originally set Adams county up with two townships, Root and St. Mary's. Root comprised the present Union township and Root township, and St. Mary's included all the rest. St. Mary's township was organized May 9, 1836.

On June 20, 1836 the area now comprising Hartford, Wabash, and Jefferson townships, and the south three miles of French, Monroe, and Blue Creek townships, was taken from St. Mary's township and called Wabash township. In March, 1838, the present Jefferson township was organized from Wabash township, and the three miles of Wabash north of Jefferson, together with the three miles of St. Mary's township north of that, was organized into the present Blue Creek township. In January, 1839, French township was taken from Wabash and St. Mary's in the same manner as Blue Creek had been done nearly a year earlier.

Monroe township was organized in March, 1840, one-half from each of the two townships, Wabash and St. Mary's. Hartford township was made from Wabash township in June, 1841. This left Wabash township as L. A. "Gus" Mann holds that it still is—six by six miles square.

In 1852 a new constitution for the state of Indiana was adopted, and the state legislature, on June 7, 1852, redefined the county boundaries as they presently are. Original plots of land were sold by the federal land grant office, and speculators held large tracts, selling small farms to settlers from the older states.

Berne was platted as a town April 5, 1872. Abraham Lehman and John Hilly formed ten lots 66 feet wide and 132 feet long, with Main street, following the Wabash-Monroe township line, going between them. The original plat, and deed, both list the town as being partly in each township.

J. F. Snow, in his Snow's history of Adams county, Indiana, published in 1907, refers to the town of Berne as being partly in Wabash township in the article on that township.

According to the Biographical and Historical Record of Adams and Wells Counties, Indiana, published by the Lewis Publishing Company in 1887, following a census in the autumn of 1886 in which Berne had a population of 341, an election was held for incorporation, and the vote was favorable, 53-25. The board of commissioners still had to act on the matter, however.

The village of Berne was incorporated March 30, 1887, according to the Standard History of Adams and Wells Counties, Indiana, edited by John W. Tyndall and published in 1918. In this book it was still listed as being partly within sections 4 and 5 of Wabash township.

The county commissioner's record for March 7, 1887, shows that on that date Berne was approved by the board of commissioners as incorporated. The record does not list the articles of incorporation, however, nor state in what township the boundaries of Berne

G.O.P. Leaders In House Seek To Save Budget

Senator Knowland In New Clash With Ike Over Budget

WASHINGTON (UP)—House Republican leaders organized today for an uphill fight to save President Eisenhower's defense budget from what he called crippling cuts.

At the same time Senate GOP Leader William F. Knowland (Cal.) clashed again with Eisenhower on a budget issue.

Knowland, who has called repeatedly for a three billion dollar cut in the overall budget, said he opposed the President's request for authority to veto individual items in appropriations bills.

House leaders admitted their prospects of reversing a \$2,587,000,000 defense cut were just about nil. Administration forces were planning to make their main stand later in the Senate.

Sen. Estes Kefauver accused Eisenhower of showing "misguided tolerance" in permitting Knowland and cabinet members to attack his policies.

Kefauver said in a prepared speech in Chattanooga, Tenn., that the President allowed Knowland, Treasury Secretary George M. Humphrey and Commerce Secretary Sinclair Weeks "to explode in a rash of 'cut that budget' declarations."

Presidential Assistant Sherman Adams Friday night called on all Republicans to rally to the support of Eisenhower's overall budget program. He said "repudiation of our party promises and programs will end in nothing but political suicide."

But the President got little backing in the House Friday for his plan to restore half the cuts made in the defense budget. The House opened debate on the big money bill Friday and a final vote is expected Wednesday.

Republican leaders were working backstage to force a test on the issue. Republican Leader Joseph W. Martin Jr. (Mass.) said amendments will be offered to restore some or all the curtailed funds listed by the President as critical. These relate mainly to Air Force procurement.

Martin said if the funds aren't restored on the customary non-record vote, he will engineer a roll call on the issue prior to the bill's final passage.

The commissioners, on petition of the residents of an area, have the power to transfer that area from one township to another. However, no evidence officially changing the township line to include all of Berne in Wabash township has yet been found. Evidence of this must be found by auditor Jaberg, county attorney David Macklin, or an interested party, and entered as evidence, to prevent the mandamus suit from taking effect.
