The Red Sox edged out the Yankees, 4-3, in the opener which went to eight innings, and in the nightcap, the Tigers took over the league lead by squeaking past the Indians, 5-4.

The Red Sox and Yankees each scored once in the first inning. The Red Sox took a 2-1 lead in the fourth on a home run by Steve Gause, but the Yankees tied it in the bottom of the sixth when Greg Ladd singled and came all the way around the bases on a bad throw from the outfield. The Red Sox took the lead with two runs in the eighth on two errors, a double by Mike Baker and Dennie Baker's single. Bob Ladd led off the Yankees' eighth with a home run. Dan Loe followed with a double, but was thrown out at the plate attempting to score the tying run after an error.

The nightcap was also close all the way. Bill Conrad's single and Dave Beery's double were good for a Tiger run in the second. The Indians scored two in the third on singles by Dick Ortiz and Ed Kohne, plus two walks and a fielder's choice. The Tigers regained the lead with a pair in the third on a walk, two errors and Conrad's second hit, and increased their lead with one run in the fourth on singles by Dave Magley and John Loe. The Indians fought back to a tie with two in the fifth on singles by Harold Ballard and Dick Landrum, a fielder's choice and a forceout. But the Tigers came right back with the winning run in the bottom of the fifth on a double by Conrad, his third straight hit, and a single by Tom McIntosh.

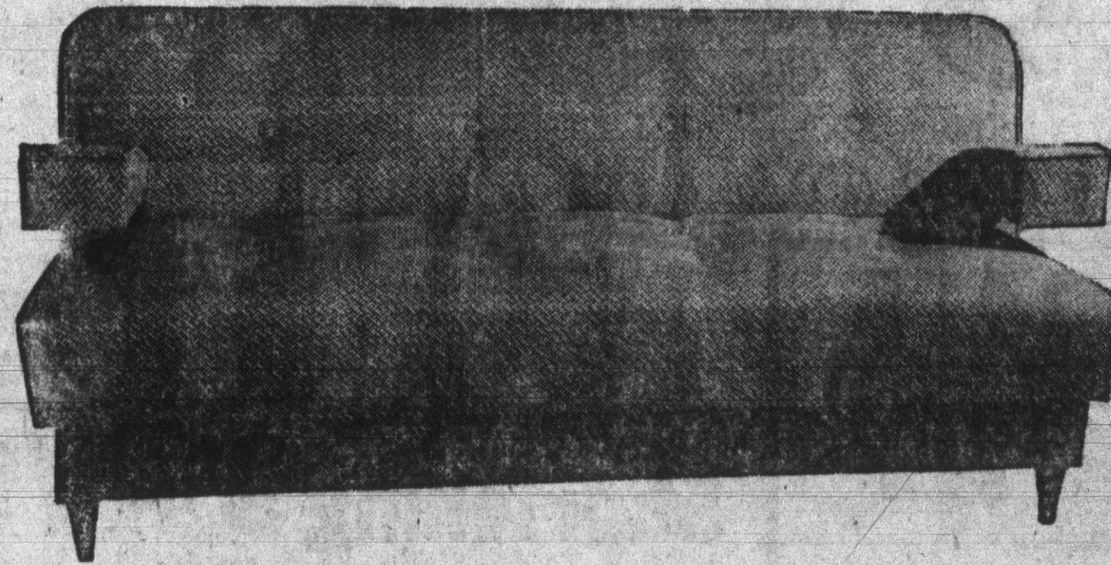

on the home field of the winner of the Decatur-Kendallville game. No admission will be charged for Monday night's game and the public is invited to attend.

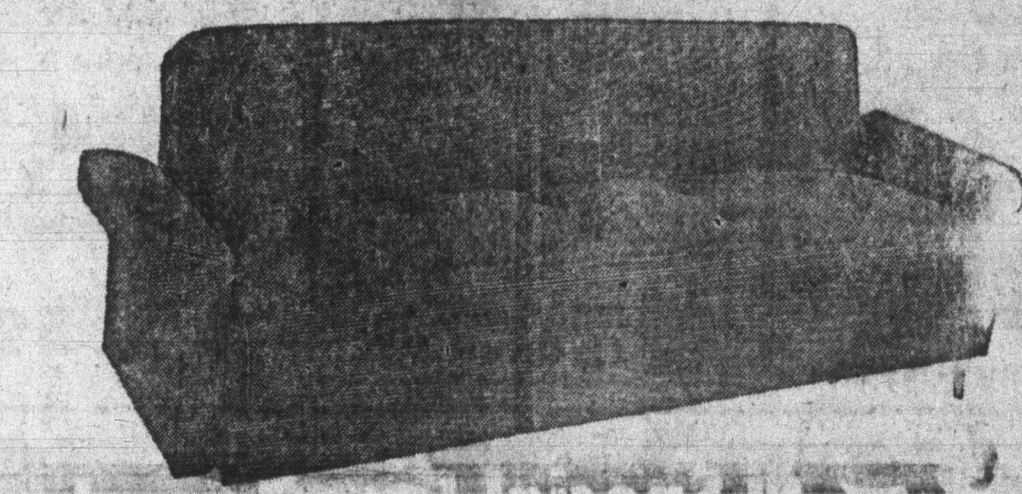

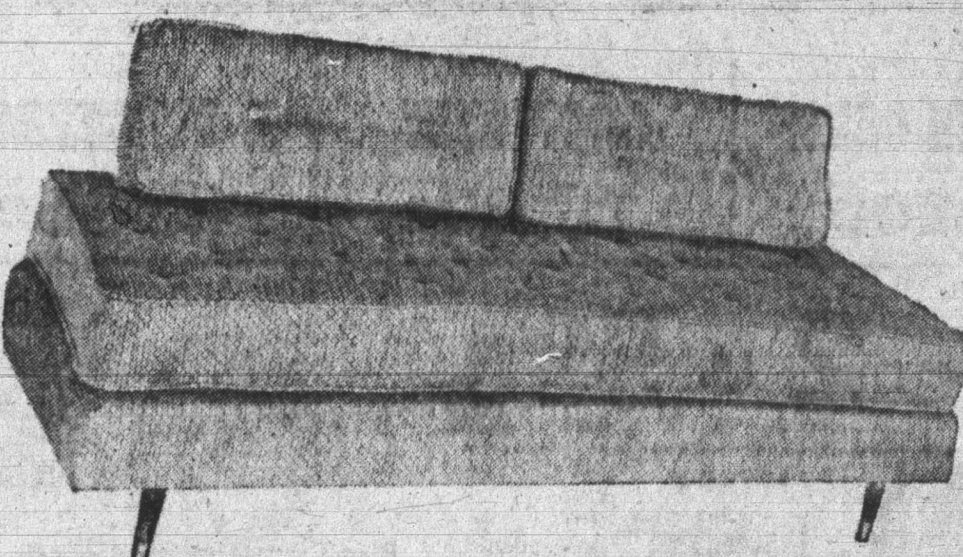
