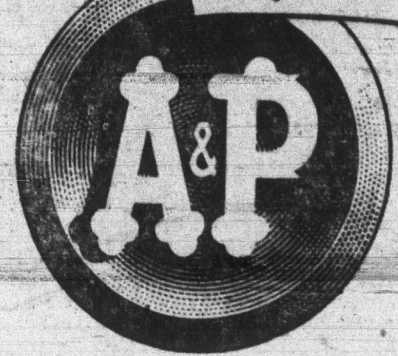

Mayors Invited To Indiana University

Weekend Meeting At
University Campus

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. — All 106 mayors in Indiana have been invited to attend a two-day weekend meeting on the Indiana University campus arranged by the IU Bureau of Government Research.

York Y. Willbern, head of the research bureau, said the mayors will find at the meeting that "their administrative headaches are pretty much alike."

On Friday, the mayors will hear a panel discussion on "Cities and the Indiana Constitution"; and talks by W. George Pinnell, associate dean of the School of Business, on "Cities and Industrial Locations," and by Joseph F. Clark, executive director of the Municipal Finance Officers Association, on "Trends in Municipal Financing."

A panel discussion on "Problems of Urban Growth" will highlight the Saturday session.

Tax Cut Needed To Restore Confidence

Says Nation Drifts
Toward Socialism

WASHINGTON, D.C. — A former Eisenhower administration official said today "we are drifting into Socialism" and a big tax cut is needed to restore business confidence.

This view was expressed by Lothar Teetor, former assistant secretary of commerce for domestic affairs, in testimony prepared for the House Ways and Means Committee.

Teetor, now an official of the Perfect Circle Corp., Hagerstown, Ind., appeared as spokesman for the Indiana State Chamber of Commerce. The committee is considering proposals for tax revisions. Prospects are dim for any major legislation until next year.

Teetor rejected the view expressed by administration officials and congressional leaders of both parties that the government can't afford to grant general tax relief now in view of the need for increased defense efforts. "All we have to do," Teetor said, "is to cut the non-essentials so we can afford the essentials." Teetor also indicated he feels his old boss—Secretary of Commerce Sinclair Weeks—may be optimistic in predicting an economic upturn in mid-summer.
