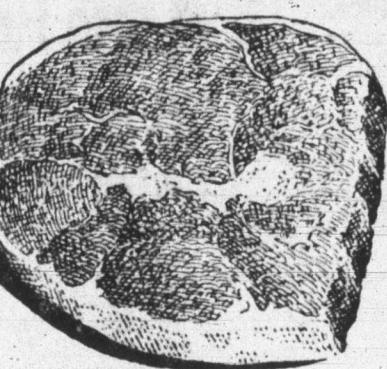

School Officials Sued For Damages

Three Middletown Teachers Are Sued

NEW CASTLE (UP)—A basketball coach and two Henry County school officials Tuesday were named in a \$25,000 assault and battery suit filed by Raymond Riley of Middletown on behalf of his son, James, 16.

Named as co-defendants in the suit filed in Henry Circuit Court were coach Von Jameson, Middletown High School Principal Fred Haskett and Butler Crawford, superintendent of Middletown-Fall Creek Twp. schools.

The suit contends the Riley youth was "assaulted, pushed, hit and beaten" by Jameson. It also charges that Haskett "assaulted the boy" not while engaged in self defense and Crawford threatened the boy.

Riley said in the suit that the alleged incident happened Sept. 25 when the school officials asked his son to return to school. He said he returned to school Nov. 1. It was then, he said, that Crawford and Haskett threatened him if he ever entered the building again.

The boy has been "ill, nervous and emotionally upset" since the incident, Riley charged in the suit.

But Haskett told United Press there is "absolutely no truth in the charges."

He said the boy was "uncooperative and because he was over the legal age limit, he was asked not to return."

"After you are over the legal age, going to school is a privilege," he said. "If you abuse the privilege you should not be allowed to go to school."

Haskett said there were witnesses to the incident which allegedly occurred during a gym period. "I was not even there, but at an elementary school and didn't return until the end of it," Haskett said.

"The boy was never struck by any teacher or school official," Haskett said. "Words were exchanged between Jameson and the boy, but no blows were struck."

The boy may have tried to hit Jameson, Haskett said, but he "didn't succeed."

Form Of Simple Life In U. S. Baby Moon

Place Yeast Cells In Future Satellite

WASHINGTON (UP)—The United States will put a simple form of life in one of its baby moons to be launched between now and March, it was learned today.

Dr. Hiden T. Cox, executive director of the American Institute of Biological Sciences, told the United Press Navy scientists are now altering satellite designs to accommodate a culture of yeast cells.

Cox said this simple form of life will yield "infinitely more significant data than putting a mammal, such as a dog," in space at the present time.

He conceded that Russia got a lot of propaganda mileage out of putting a dog in Sputnik II. He said there are indications that Russia will put simple life in future satellites.

Cox said "it is possible" yeast cells will be put in the next U.S. attempt to shoot a six-inch moon into orbit with a Vanguard rocket at Cape Canaveral, Fla. He said he did not know definitely which of the four tests will carry the simple life into space.

The United States plans to make "another attempt" soon to put a test satellite into orbit, although officials have pointed out that this is not the primary purpose of the next test.

Russia has announced its Sputnik I disintegrated Jan. 4 and its second satellite which carried a dog will burn up soon.

Rear Adm. Rawson Bennett, chief of naval research, told the United Press some "of the boys in the back room" are pushing to get some kind of life aloft with the test moons. But he said "as far as I know the next test will just be another test."
