

Annual Financial Report From Church
St. Mary's Church Receipts Increase

Total receipts for the St. Mary's Catholic church this year were \$103,692.11, an increase of \$6,622.80 over last year, the Very Rev. Msgr. J. J. Seimetz reported to his congregation Sunday. In the future a new home for the Catholic sisters will be need-

ed, the Monsignor mentioned. There were 81,045 communions and 20,179 confessions during the year. There were 105 baptisms, 21 funerals, 19 burials, and 18 marriages. High school enrollment was 126, with 10 teachers, and the grade school has 559 students, and 11 teachers.

The report was made by the trustees of the church, including Msgr. J. J. Seimetz, the Rev. Robert Contant, the Rev. Robert Jaeger, John Kohne, William Kuhne, Francis Geimer, William Lengerich, and John Schuriger.
