Jackets Lose To Berne Bears In Dual Meet

The Berne Bears defeated the Decatur Yellow Jackets, 60-51, in a closely contested dual meet Thursday afternoon at Worthman field in this city.

The Bears won five individual events and both relay races, while the Jackets won five events, with a tie for first in the pole vault.

Larry Moses, of Decatur, was the only multiple winner, copping both hurdle races and also the broad jump.

The Jackets will also compete in a triangular meet with Bluffton and Ossian at Bluffton Tuesday, and also in the New Haven relays April 26.
