Disarmament: Atomic Energy Commission Chairman Lewis L. Strauss rejected as "spurious" proposals for halting nuclear weapons testing without at the same time cutting off nuclear weapons output and starting to switch atomic material to peaceful uses. Strauss told the Senate disarmament subcommittee a moratorium on testing would be "advantageous" to Russia and would "freeze" U.S. defensive research.


