NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS
Public notice is hereby given that the Board of Trustees of the Town of Monroe in Adams County, Indiana, desiring to enter into an electric utility franchise, grant and agreement with Indiana & Michigan Electric Company, did, at a meeting of said Board of Trustees, determine the exact form of such franchise, grant and agreement to be finally adopted, which form is in words and figures as follows:

THIS AGREEMENT, made this day of August, 1958, by and between the TOWN OF MONROE, in the County of Adams, Indiana, acting by and through its Board of Trustees (hereinafter called the "Municipality," party of the first part, and INDIANA & MICHIGAN ELECTRIC COMPANY, an Indiana corporation (hereinafter called the "Grantee"), party of the second part, WITNESSETH:

Section 1. The Municipality hereby grants unto the Grantee, its successors and assigns, an indeterminate permit, franchise, right and privilege to have, install, construct, maintain, replace, renew, repair, enlarge, extend and operate, by and through its employees, agents, servants and assigns, within its present and future corporate limits, poles, wires, cables, conduits, transformers, substations, towers, meters, posts and other equipment and structures, and their appurtenances and appliances (hereinafter called the "electric facilities") for the purpose of supplying, transmitting, distributing and furnishing electric energy to the Municipality and the inhabitants thereof and the public in general, and all customers of the Grantee residing within or without the corporate limits of the Municipality, for lighting, heating, power and all other purposes, including the right to transmit, distribute and use electric energy, furnish, supply and sell electric energy within the Municipality and to transmit and carry the same through or by means of the electric facilities to territory beyond the Municipality, and to use the same for the purpose of and subject to all reasonable police regulation now or hereafter enacted by the Municipality, pertaining to the use of the streets and the location of the electric facilities.

Section 2. In the installation, maintenance, renewal, replacement, extension and repair of the electric facilities installed by the Grantee hereunder, the Grantee shall obstruct the streets, alleys and public places to such an extent only as shall be reasonably necessary.

Section 3. The Grantee may make any necessary excavations and openings in the streets, alleys and public places of the Municipality for the purpose of installing, maintaining, renewing, replacing, extending and repairing the electric facilities, and in making such excavations and openings shall, by signal, guards, barricades or other means, protect the same from injury to persons and property; and the Grantee shall save and hold the Municipality harmless from all damages, costs and expenses which the Municipality may be compelled to pay proximately caused by the default, carelessness, or neglect of the Grantee in the construction, maintenance and operation of the electric facilities, provided the Municipality shall promptly notify the Grantee of any claim of damage, cost or expense.

Section 4. The Grantee shall use all reasonable diligence and precaution to furnish and maintain a regular, adequate and dependable and uninterrupted supply of electric energy for distribution and sale to the Municipality and the inhabitants thereof; but the Grantee shall not be liable for any damage occurring to the Municipality or any customer in consequence of any failure to supply electric energy of any particular character or at any time or times if such failure is without fault or neglect on the part of the Grantee or when such failure is due to strikes, storms, accidents, riots, acts of the public enemy, delays of any common carrier, default of any connecting utility, judicial process, acts of God, state or municipal interferences, any governmental restrictions or regulations, breakdowns of or injuries to machinery, transmission or distribution system, or necessary repairs, or other causes beyond the control of the Grantee.

Military leaders in the past have stressed that nuclear weapons always are considered as part of the U. S. arsenal for use under appropriate circumstances.

explosions can be used to manufacture isotopes. "It is possible in a few months of a second to produce quantities of isotopes which take months and years by ordinary methods, and to produce isotopes which cannot be produced except in the most valuable and expensive chain-reacting piles," he said. The isotopes would be imbedded in hundreds of tons of rock pulverized by the subterranean nuclear explosion. Libby indicated that they might be economically removed.
