All of the schools in Decatur will participate in the mass fire drill sponsored by WOWO Wednesday morning between 9:45 and 10 o'clock along with over 700 other schools taking part in the event, it was announced today. Sr. M. Alemda, of the Catholic schools, Hugh J. Andrews, of Decatur high school, and W. Guy Brown, superintendent of schools, each announced the plans for the Decatur schools to take part in the mass drill.

Over 700 schools throughout Indiana, Michigan and Ohio area have been invited to participate in the mass fire drill. This will be the 13th consecutive year that such a mass evacuation program has been sponsored by WOWO radio. "Smoky the Bear" will give the signal over WOWO that will evacuate the schools. The signal will come sometime during the 15-minute program which begins at 9:45 a.m. and which is designed to give added emphasis to safety in schools during fire prevention week.
