

Plan Art Workshop For School Teachers

Teachers Of County To Attend Workshop

An art workshop for all primary and kindergarten school teachers is being planned for October 18 at the Adams Central high school, Miss Kathryn Kaufman, art supervisor in the Decatur schools announced today.

Harold E. Radatz, assistant art superintendent of Fort Wayne, will be in charge of the event. Radatz will give demonstrations on arts and crafts, and will show exhibits of grade school pupils from Fort Wayne. The exhibits to be shown are: finger painting; paper sack masks; paper bag puppets; scrap material printing; and Japanese lantern masks.

Radatz has been assistant art superintendent at Fort Wayne since 1952. Previous to this, he was

an instructor at the junior high school in Warsaw. He has shown exhibits in Fort Wayne, South Bend and Indianapolis. Ceramics were featured by Radatz at these exhibits.

The workshop, which is sponsored by the art education association of Adams county in co-operation with the school systems, will be held from 8:30 to 12 noon at Adams Central.

Retired Minister Dies Unexpectedly

Rev. Elmer Smith Dies At Hospital

Funeral services will be at 2 p.m. Thursday for the Rev. Elmer F. Smith, 66, of Berne, a retired minister of the Evangelical United Brethren faith, who died suddenly at 4:30 p.m. Monday at the Adams county memorial hospital following a cerebral hemorrhage.

Rev. Smith was a native of Mercer county, but had lived in Adams county since 1950. He had been ill only a few hours.

Surviving are the widow, Edith; two sons, Elmer J. Smith of Berne, and Gerald E. Smith of Bremen; two daughters, Mrs. Verne Dietrich, of Naperville, Ill.; and Miss Dorcas E. Smith, of Richmond; a brother, a sister, two half-brothers, a half-sister, a stepbrother, two stepsisters, and nine grandchildren.

The body is at the Yager funeral home, where friends may call after noon Wednesday.

Services will be held at the Trinity Evangelical United Brethren church in Berne, where Rev. Smith was a member. The Rev. A. E. Givens will officiate. Burial will be in the MRE cemetery.

Mrs. Carl Bohnke Is Taken By Death

Mrs. Carl Bohnke, 54, a native of Berne, was dead on arrival at 8:30 a.m. Monday at the St. Joseph's hospital in Fort Wayne, where she was taken following a heart attack. A resident of Fort Wayne most of her life, she was a member of the Salem Evangelical and Reformed church.

Survivors include the husband, Carl; two brothers, Paul and Alton Liddy; one sister, Mrs. Lester Daughtry, all of Fort Wayne; and another sister, Mrs. Robert Young, of Columbia, Mo. The body was taken to the Tom Mungovan funeral home, where friends may call after 7 p.m. today. Services will be held Thursday at 10 a.m. in the funeral home, with the Rev. Willard H. Zinke officiating. Burial will be in Lindenwood cemetery.

Hartke Hits Delay In Highway Plans

Much Of Delay Due To Road Scandals

MARSHALL, Ind. (UPI)—Democratic senatorial nominee Vance Hartke said today that delays in carrying out highway improvement plans are "claiming additional lives daily" in Indiana traffic.

Hartke told a Parke County women's audience that the Republican state administration was responsible.

"Much of the delay is due to the highway scandals," he said. "The death rate continues to climb."

Hartke referred specifically to U.S. 41 which runs through Parke County. He said accidents on that road "claimed some 20 lives last year while the present state administration promised better roads and wallowed in the highway scandal mess."

In two political talks Monday night, at Vincennes and Sullivan, Hartke assailed his opponent, Governor Handley, for lack of leadership and violation of the Indiana Constitution.

"Our governor has done little of

anything and much of nothing for the good people of Indiana at a time when Hoosiers hearts cry for direction," Hartke said at Sullivan. "This is massive inaction."

He said at Vincennes that Handley's disregard of the constitution in running for the Senate before his gubernatorial term ended would backfire.

"The people won't let him run out," Hartke said. "If only they could turn him down in his wild bid for senator and turn him out of his gray train as governor, too, the job would be completed."

"I predict they (the voters) will elect a Democratic Legislature to keep a check rein on him."

Ohio Congressman Found Dead In Home

COSHOCOTON, Ohio (UPI)—U.S. Rep. J. Harry McGregor, a Republican who had represented Ohio's 17th District in Congress for 18 years, was found dead in his apartment Monday. He was 63.

McGregor's body was found shortly after 8:30 a.m. A physician said he had been dead about six hours, apparently of a heart ailment.

Although the congressman had a history of heart trouble, he had been campaigning actively for reelection.

Four Persons Killed In Indiana Traffic

Six-Year-Old Girl Is Killed By Auto

United Press International—Four persons were killed in Indiana traffic today, piling up new fatalities charged against October after a weekend marked by 12 deaths.

The latest victims included a 6-year-old Washington girl killed by a car enroute to school, a 68-year-old Indianapolis man struck by a car and a truck in a main highway, a Gary man whose car went out of control on the Northern Indiana Toll Road, and a Bicknell man whose car overturned near Vincennes.

Carl Bingham, 6, Washington, became that city's first traffic death victim of the year when she ran into the side of a car while crossing a street enroute to school.

Daniel E. Shae, 49, Gary, was killed when his car struck a toll road guard rail near Gary, apparently when he dozed at the wheel.

William H. Benton, 68, Indianapolis, was struck by two vehicles in U.S. 31 south of Indianapolis

in the early-morning darkness. Virgil K. Hopper, 63, Bicknell, was killed late Monday when a hit-run car struck him as he ran into a street. Robert C. Anderson, 42, Beech Grove, surrendered 20 minutes after the accident as driver of the car and was released on bond pending a hearing on reckless homicide and drunk driving charges.
