Seven Americans were among eighty-five delegates and observers who attended the opening of a week-long Asian conference sponsored in Rangoon, Burma, by the World Student Christian Federation.

The Communists are spending \$40 for every \$1 the United States is putting into literature to reach the minds of the world's uncommitted peoples, and non-Christian cults are spending more than all Protestant efforts combined to win converts.

Millions of children are being sent to boarding schools for training and work away from home as a part of Communist China's new commune system, according to a Hong Kong dispatch to the New York Times. A communist source says: "Parents should understand that their children are going to live in a communist state, that it is for society to raise and educate the young into a new generation and

give the kind of love that no maternal love can ever hope to compare with."

The American church family continues to grow. Membership now stands at 104,189,678 for all faiths—a gain for the year of 964,724. Of the nation's estimated 170,500,000 population, 61 per cent are reported members of churches or synagogues. This is nearly twice as high as that for the turn of the century.

Nearly 40 persons from 11 foreign countries undertook studies in the United States during 1958 under the auspices of the National Lutheran Council's International Exchange Program. At the same time, 15 Americans traveled to Europe to study various phases of church work, while an additional 15 foreign visitors to the U.S. under private auspices were aided by the Lutheran program.
