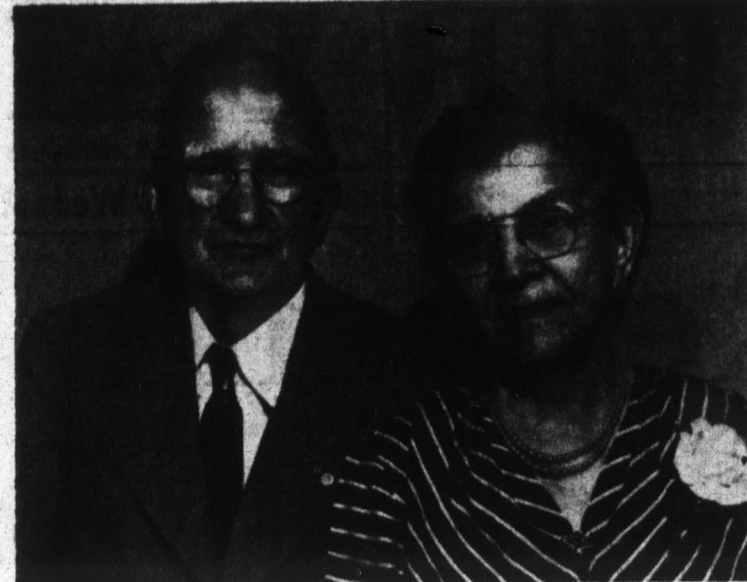

A neighbor called the fire de-  
partment when he saw flames  
and smoke pouring from the  
Sprinkle home southeast of Los  
Angeles.

Cause of the fire was not de-  
termined, but it was thought a  
smouldering cigarette may have  
started it.
