kle, 25, and his wife, Beryl, 27,
returned to their home shortly
after 1 a.m. after attending the
party. Thelma George, 15, said
she had been sitting with the
Sprinkle children, David Jr., 6,
and Star, 5.

A neighbor called the fire de-
partment when he saw flames
and smoke pouring from the
Sprinkle home southeast of Los
Angeles.

Cause of the fire was not de-
termined, but it was thought a
smouldering cigarette may have
started it.
