Report Progress To End Packers Strike

CHICAGO (UPI)—Progress was reported Wednesday in talks to settle the 13-day-old strike of 18,000 Swift & Co. workers.

At the same time, negotiations were deadlocked at Wilson & Co., where bargainers sought to head off a threatened Saturday strike.

Federal mediators said another meeting was scheduled today between officials of Swift and representatives of the United Packinghouse Workers of America and the Amalgamated Meat Cutters and Butchers Workmen unions.

Charles Alsip, regional director of the Federal Mediation Service, said "definite progress" was made Wednesday toward ending the walkout at Swift plants in 34 cities.

The Packinghouse Workers union accused Wilson of using "blackjack bargaining" methods to force a settlement "nearly 10 cents an hour less in benefits than the settlements reached recently with Armour and other meat industry leaders."

The union, representing some 5,700 workers, announced it was cancelling a contract extension on Saturday. Wilson said it interpreted the action "as an indication that the union intends to call a strike at that time."

Washington (UPI)—The Agriculture Department today predicted the 1959 fall pig crop in 10 corn belt states will be about 5 percent larger than in 1958, and 23 percent larger than the 1948-57 average.

In June, the department forecast the fall pig crop would be up 7 percent in these states from last year.

The department estimated the number of sows farrowed and intended to farrow this fall at 4,501,000 head for the 10 states—Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, South Dakota, Nebraska, and Kansas.

Farrowings are above a year earlier in eight states but below last year in Wisconsin and South Dakota. Increases are 9 percent in Minnesota, 8 percent in Missouri, 7 percent in Iowa, 6 percent in Ohio, 4 percent in Illinois, and 1 percent in Indiana, Kansas, and Nebraska.

Spokesmen for the European groups whose "revolt" last year paved De Gaulle's path to power could find nothing to praise in the new plan except his refusal to negotiate with France's Arab foes.

There was no immediate reaction from the Algerian refugee "government" in Tunis, although its leaders are known to have listened to the broadcast.

The Europeans were specifically critical of De Gaulle's plan to let the people of Algeria decide their own future in a referendum that seems sure to be dominated by the Arab majority.

He said the voters would be allowed to choose among three alternatives: Secession, "self-government in close association with France," or complete integration with the mother country.
