Third Miss Indiana Contest Is Planned

INDIANAPOLIS (UPI) — The Hoosier state, which already is blessed with two "Miss Indiana's", is about to get a third one, this time a sort of rural Miss America nominee.

So far, Morgan is the only Indiana county to pick a nominee for the title of "Miss Rural Electrification" to be decided in St. Louis Feb. 22-25 at the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association convention.

State REMC officials said that if other counties conduct contests between now and next February, there will be a state Hoosier elimination. If they do not then 18-year-old Miss Betty Jo McFarren, R.R. 1, Gosport, who was named Miss Morgan County REMC last Saturday at Martinsville, may represent the state by default.

The brunette beauty, a sophomore at Indiana University, won her title over 17 other country girl chieftains in the first such contest ever held in Indiana. A few states have been entering the contest for the past nine years, but the idea of a rural beauty queen has gained slow acceptance. Thirteen states were represented in the 1958 contest.

Dave Thompson, Frankfort, Ky., one of the judges in the Martinsville contest, said he hoped the idea "would catch on in Indiana." He said Kentucky has a full fledged rural beauty contest going with the county winners competing for the state title at the annual state fair.

One difficulty in the way of such a third Indiana contest would appear to be the rapidity with which "Miss" becomes "Mrs." At least four of the 18 Morgan County beauties said they were to wed soon. And judging, not only by appearances but by their announced talents, most of the others soon will be.

Under the heading of talent, most of the girls said they liked to cook and sew, achievements not given much notice in the contests leading to the Miss America-Miss Universe titles.

The multi-purpose room, which has crept into home plans in recent years, now is becoming a frequent item in construction of new schools.
