



A total of one million dollars in cash and pledges has been received for the new headquarters building of the World Council of Churches in Geneva, Switzerland; \$300,000 has come from member church of the World Council.

A postage stamp issued in Greenland honors the Christian missionary from whom the country's entire modern history is dated. Bishop Hans Egede of Norway led the settlement of Greenland starting in 1721.

In the Diet, Japan's counterpart of the United States Congress, there are 18 Christians among its 250 members, or 7 per cent. The minister of finance is a Protestant Christian. Other outstanding Protestant citizens include the director of the Atomic Power Research Institute, Crown Prince Akihito's private tutor, several banking leaders and the presidents of a number of manufacturing companies.

Reinhold Niebuhr, noted Protestant theologian of Union Theological Seminary, was one of four men



lected to the American Academy of Arts and Letters, an honorary society of artists, writers, and composers.

Representative Denver Hargis of Kansas has introduced a joint resolution proposing the so-called Christian Amendment to the Constitution. This raises to nine the number of Congressional sponsors of the amendment in the current session of Congress. So far, the amendment has not been introduced in the Senate this session. Under the so-called "Christian Amendment," a provision would be added to the U.S. Constitution declaring: "This nation devoutly recognizes the authority and law of Jesus Christ, Saviour and Ruler of Nations, through whom are bestowed the blessings of Almighty God."
