Miss Connie Kiess Wins Poetry Honor

Miss Connie Kiess, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Edgar Kiess, and a senior at Decatur high school, won plaudits for her poetry for the national high school poetry association. Miss Kiess received acceptance for her "Song of a Winter Night," which will be published in the annual "Anthology of High School Poetry."

Miss Kiess, who is taught college prep English by Miss Catherine Weidner, has exhibited proficiency in both poetry and prose and she has also written several of the works used in the annual Christmas program at the high school.

An "anthology," taking the word back to the early origin, means a collection of rare poetic passages. In the literal sense today, it retains the same meaning.

Pupils from all over the country submitted verses for publication in the book, and no charge is made for entries. All work, however, is done under classroom supervision to discount the possibility of plagiarism. Miss Kiess' work originated under the guidance of Miss Weidner.

Dennis Hartman, secretary of the association, said that the entries usually reach between two and three thousand, and of this number only a mere handful is chosen for print. He said it reflects good credit on the school and the pupil can reap personal satisfaction by seeing the work in print, besides comparing his work with the work of peers throughout the country.
