

Carole Tregoff Still In Love With Finch

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — Carole Tregoff is still in love with Dr. Bernard Finch despite the ordeal of their trial for murder.

Don Bringsold, attorney for the redhead mistress, said Tuesday it was "obvious" the 23-year-old divorcee still loved the surgeon accused of killing his wife to break up one-third of a triangle.

Miss Tregoff was to be brought into the case directly for the first time today.

Waiting to testify were the proprietors of two apartments in nearby Monterey Park where Finch set up Miss Tregoff as a mistress and another in Las Vegas, Nev., which the doctor rented for his sweetheart and where he was found the day after his wife's killing.

Defense attorney Grant Cooper tried to give the murder trial the aspect of a "meddler" Tuesday with evidence that Mrs. Barbara Jean Finch, 33, spent an evening at the Los Angeles West Side Tennis Club with another man the evening of her death last July 18.

The man was identified as Herbert Adair, an investigator in the office of divorce lawyer Joseph Forno who was representing Mrs. Finch in the suit against her husband. Cooper said Tuesday he intended to call Adair as a witness.

Bringsold, one of the attorneys from ace lawyer Jerry Giesler's stable, is the man assigned to

stay with Miss Tregoff constantly through the trial.

He was asked about reports that the former model and the doctor are affectionate during their lunches together and whether they are still in love.

"I think it is obvious," he said. "Obvious, yes or no?" he was asked.

"Yes," he said.

Doubt Flu Outbreak Of Epidemic Size

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The U.S. Public Health Service does not expect the current rash of influenza outbreaks around the country to mushroom to the size of the 1958 Asia flu epidemic.

Nevertheless, acting Surgeon General John D. Porterfield urged persons over 55, individuals with heart or lung diseases and pregnant women to ask their doctors whether they need flu shots.

The Health Service advised persons who develop flu symptoms — fever, aches and sore throat — to go to bed and call their physicians. There is no specific treatment for the ailment, officials said.

Government laboratory tests show the outbreaks in Ohio, Michigan, Texas and Hawaii to be Asian flu. The same may be true of cases in Tennessee, Kentucky, California, Nevada and Utah.

Arthur S. Flemming, secretary of health, education and welfare told a news conference Tuesday. "The Public Health Service feels that the many scattered outbreaks so early in the influenza season indicate that the disease is well seeded in the country and can be expected to appear in many localized concentrations."

Porterfield said he felt the disease would be confined to "localized outbreaks" and would not compare with the 1958 epidemic.

Differ On Removal Of Interest Ceiling


WASHINGTON (UPI) — Lawmakers differed today about whether President Eisenhower has a chance of persuading Congress in its brief election-year session to remove the 4½ per cent interest ceiling on government bonds.

Administration backers were encouraged by the fact that Democratic leaders displayed willingness to consider the legislation, even though Senate or House floor action probably would produce a party-splitting battle.

Rep. Lee Metcalf (D-Mont.), leader of a liberal Democratic bloc, conceded the legislation has a "50-50 chance" of House passage despite opposition that "it hasn't a chance in the world" of getting through the Senate.

Hearings by the Senate Finance Committee probably will provide the first real test of public and senatorial sentiment on the issue. Committee Chairman Harry F. Byrd (D-Va.) who favors the legislation, plans hearings soon.

The last session of Congress rejected the proposal, first submitted by the President last June. The President renewed his request in a special message Tuesday. He termed its enactment "imperative" to the nation's continued economic growth.

No Political Motive Behind Russian Tests

NICE, France (UPI) — Top Soviet space scientist Anatoly Blagonravov said today there was no pre-summit political motive behind Russian plans to test-fire new and more powerful rockets in the central Pacific.

He said the only reason for the tests Jan. 15-Feb. 15, "is the need to experiment with bigger and more powerful rockets over greater distances as we tackle new problems in our space programs."

Blagonravov scotched speculation that the rockets would be nuclear-powered. He also said they would not carry "explosive nuclear charges."

But he said the rockets are powerful enough to hurl a manned vehicle into space, adding that it does not necessarily follow that this is the basic purpose of the test series.

Blagonravov, who heads the three-man Soviet delegation to the first International Space Symposium which opened here Monday, said there was a "very simple reason" for the selection of the target area in the Pacific between the Hawaiian Islands and the Gilbert Islands.

"We had to choose an area where we could send ships to observe the results of the experiments," he said. "It would be hard to send ships to the north polar regions. At the same time, we had to choose an area relatively free of shipping."

Nobel-prize winning U.S. scientist Harold C. Urey, one of the 65 Americans at the conference, said he believed the Pacific tests are part of the Soviet military missile development program.

"I don't see what we're getting so excited about," he said. "I think it's the Russian equivalent of Cape Canaveral. We've got to test our long-range rockets over the ocean and so do they."

Drizzle, Fog And Rain Over Indiana

Drizzle, fog and rain remained firmly installed across Indiana today as the state experienced some of the warmest January temperatures on record.

No new "heat" marks were set Tuesday in the latest chapter of abnormally warm weather, but the mercury advanced to 69 at Evansville, 66 at Indianapolis and 60 at Lafayette, with South Bend and Fort Wayne barely below the 60s.

New rainfall of around 1½ inches at South Bend and Lafayette for the 24-hour period ending at dawn today raised the two-day totals to around three inches at South Bend.

But the heavy rain in the far north was not matched elsewhere around Hoosierland. Indianapolis had less than half an inch, Evansville even less.

The warm, moist air was due to stay in Indiana for a few more days, at least. The five-day outlook called for cooler but still above-normal temperatures today and only minor changes through next Monday. Rain totaling nearly an inch was expected Thursday and Friday and again about Sunday.

The 66-degree reading at Indianapolis Tuesday was only three degrees off the all-time record for the date.

Overnight lows today ranged from 39 at South Bend to 59 at Evansville. Today's highs were expected to range from the 40s north to near 60 south, tonight's lows from the 30s to the 40s, and Thursday's highs from the low 40s to the low 50s.

Express Regret On Shaving Incident

SEOUL, Korea (UPI) — U.S. Ambassador Walter P. McConeau and United Nations Commander Gen. Carter B. Magruder today expressed official regrets to Korea over an incident in which two American soldiers shaved the heads of two Korean prostitutes.

The two prostitutes were trespassing on a U.S. Army reservation looking for customers when they were caught and shaved, but the incident created a furor in Korea. The Army captain who ordered the head-shaving was relieved of his command.
