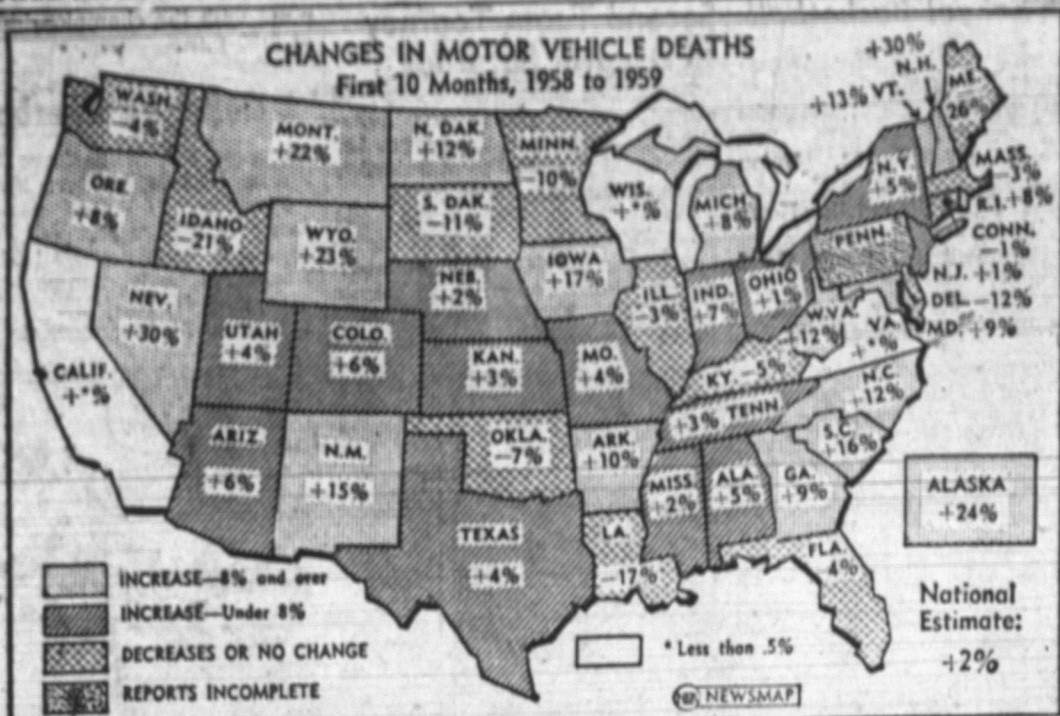

THE HIGHWAY BATTLEFIELD—According to latest tabulations from the National Safety Council, 1959 gives promise of being a slightly worse year for traffic deaths than 1958. Deaths were up 2 per cent through October. The death rate, however, was down 2 per cent from the same period in 1958 because traffic mileage (some 500 billion miles) was up 4 per cent. As of October, 30,560 Americans had died in traffic. Disabling injuries had laid up over one million persons.

Temperature Near Zero In Indiana

The mercury plunged within a

few degrees of zero in Indiana today, and new flurries deepened a blanket of snow in the far north. It was 5 above at Lafayette, 6 above at Fort Wayne, 9 at South Bend and Indianapolis as the temperature fell to its coldest points of the year.

Snow activity increased to 7 inches the ground cover at South Bend.

Forecasts indicated no letup in the chill temperatures. After highs ranging from 18 to 30 today, the mercury will shrink to a range of 5 to 18 above tonight, then climb to a range of 22 to 30 Friday.

Wednesday's high marks ranged from 18 at South Bend to 29 at Evansville.

Scattered snow flurries were expected to continue through Friday at least.

Bandit Is Taken To Prison By Ambulance

JEFFERSONVILLE, Ind. (UPI)—A bandit shot in a service station holdup was taken to prison in an ambulance Wednesday to begin a 10 to 25 year term.

Melvin McKinney, 55, Charlestown, pleaded guilty before Clark Circuit Judge James L. Bottorff when he was taken to court from a hospital. McKinney was shot in the abdomen and the foot by the service station owner Jan. 2 at Charlestown when he demanded \$500.

Ike Likely To Expand Visit To Far East

WASHINGTON (UPI)—President Eisenhower appeared likely today to expand his Far Eastern visit next June to include South Korea, Formosa and the Philippines as well as Japan.

The White House announced Wednesday the President would visit Japan about June 20 on his way home from Russia. A stop in Japan would require visits to other major U.S. Allies in Asia to prevent hurt feelings.

Diplomats said arrangements were being made for Eisenhower to go to Seoul, Taipei, and Manila. Other possible stops in the Orient included South Viet Nam, Thailand and neutralist Indonesia. The Chief Executive also was reported considering stops in Hawaii and Alaska.

At home, the President's round the world trip to the Soviet Union—seemed destined to cause some discomfort in Democratic circles from a political viewpoint.

A key Democratic leader, who preferred to remain anonymous, expressed fear that Eisenhower's travels would make it difficult for Democratic dark-horse candidates to get maximum publicity just before the party nominating convention at Los Angeles in July.

Eisenhower's trip, marking the first visit by an American chief executive to Russia and the Orient, undoubtedly will dominate the news during the final weeks of June.

The President's December trip to 11 nations was the top story in the newspapers and over the radio and television stations in this country for nearly three weeks.

Find \$3,964.11 On Body Of Dead Man

GARY, Ind. (UPI)—A retired steel worker with \$3,964.11 hidden in his clothing was killed Wednesday night when he stepped in front of a train.

Dan Manankoff, 65, who lived alone in a Gary hotel, was hit by a New York Central train at a downtown Gary crossing. When police examined the body to determine identification, they found the small fortune hidden in various parts of his clothing and even in his shoes.

Flu Vaccine Stock Largely Depleted

INDIANAPOLIS (UPI)—Eli Lilly & Co. said today it has sold all of its influenza vaccine despite the fact it manufactured four times as much of the vaccine as normally would be sold between Jan. 1 and April 1.

However, the big drug firm said another supply of the vaccine would be available by the middle of next week and further stocks would be ready two or three weeks later.

A Lilly spokesman said the firm's supply of the vaccine was depleted largely because of the heavy demand on the West Coast which has been hard hit by the flu.

"We began the year with twice as much stock as we ordinarily would expect to sell by April 1," Henry DeBoest, executive director of sales, said. "This was exhausted by the unprecedented demand from the West Coast."

"Meanwhile we had put into the market a like supply," he said, "which means we have sold four times the quantity of flu vaccine we expected to by April 1."
