


## Poll Tax Fight Is Threat To Senate

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Another civil rights hassle — this time over the poll tax — threatened today to snarl the Senate ahead of the scheduled Feb. 15 showdown on the rights issue.

The anti-poll tax measure, in the form of a proposed constitutional amendment barring the tax as a voting requirement, was the pending business when the Senate resumed work.

Sen. Spessard L. Holland (D-Fla.) introduced the amendment Wednesday. He tacked it onto an unrelated measure sponsored by Sens. Estes Kefauver (D-Tenn.) and Thomas J. Dodd (D-Conn.). Their resolution — also a constitutional amendment — would permit state governors to appoint House members to replace lawmakers killed in a nuclear attack.

Holland's amendment was expected to arouse opposition from most Southerners — and also from some liberals who have introduced another bill to outlaw the poll tax, but by simple law.

Other congressional news:

**Tranquillizers:** Rep. John A. Blatnik (D-Minn.), who headed a 1958 House investigation of tranquilizer advertising, gave his views to a Senate anti-trust subcommittee. Subcommittee Chairman Sen. Estes Kefauver (D-Tenn.) has indicated Congress would be asked to pass new laws restricting drug ads.

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
