## Ike Launches GOP Campaign In California

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — President Eisenhower appeared today to have charted his course of political action for the pre-convention stages of the 1960 campaign: Steer clear of personalities for the time being and drum on the issues of inflation and national security.

Speaking from here Wednesday night to thousands of Republican party workers gathered at "dinner with Ike" fund-raising parties across the nation, the President hammered away at Democratic fiscal policies. He stressed repeatedly how America had prospered into the world's most powerful nation, militarily and economically, during the first seven years of his administration.

This was his first major political speech of the national election year and he spoke in the home state of the Republican most likely to run to succeed him, Vice President Richard M. Nixon. Yet, not once during his closed circuit television talk to 80 party dinners did Eisenhower mention the vice president's name.

**Nixon On Program**  
Nixon appeared on the program, speaking from Chicago, as did GOP leaders in a number

of other cities and all of them lavished praise on the President. Nixon made the actual introduction of the President.

Eisenhower was deeply grateful and visibly touched by the laudatory remarks, but he concentrated his oratory on issues with never a mention of the next GOP national slate.

He spoke at a roast beef dinner for 6,700 party workers and contributors in the huge Pan-Pacific Auditorium which was decorated with large pictures of the President and Nixon and a giant electrified map of the route Eisenhower took last month to Europe, Asia, the Middle East and Africa.

**Answers Voter's Request**  
The format of Eisenhower's speech was an elaborate reply to a request he received for political advice from a young first voter, 21-year-old Shirley Jean Havens of Arvada, Colo. Mrs. Havens wrote the President last month, saying she wanted advice on which party to join and asking "what the Republican party stands for."

He replied with a bid to all other young or undecided voters to follow the GOP route to continued prosperity and national strength. He did not call the Democrats by name, but he attributed to his political opposition fiscal policies detrimental to economic well-being of the country.

"Republicans flatly reject the argument that the nation can pump its way to permanent prosperity by an outpouring of federal dollars," he said in warning against excessive government spending.

**Seek Strike Dollar**  
"To pay for costly and highly publicized phoney panaceas for all our problems," he said, "many politicians seem to believe that money by the bale can be printed without shrinking—a kind of sanitized dollar. We know better. It is the unshakable aim of the Republican party to make certain that your dollar will buy today and tomorrow as much as it did yesterday."

In the seven years of Democratic rule preceding his inauguration in 1953, he said the general price structure rose an "unconscionable" 48 per cent, but had gone up only 10 per cent since 1953.

"This record is one for every thinking citizen to applaud, but it is not good enough, and we Republicans propose to make it better," he said.

## President Of Cuba Blames United States

HAVANA (UPI) — President Osvaldo Dorticos Torrado blamed the United States Wednesday night for differences between America and Cuba, but said he believes they can be "resolved effectively" by diplomatic means.

In a televised reply to President Eisenhower's press-conference re-

marks about Cuba this week, Dorticos challenged the U.S. President on almost every point. The tone of his speech, however, was not hostile.

Dorticos was especially sharp in his rejection of Eisenhower's assertion that the "intrigues of international communism" are a factor in the growing coolness between the United States and Cuba.

He said American "misunderstanding" of the Cuban revolution, coupled with the "wrongs inflicted on our nation" by the United States were the main causes of the current friction between the two countries.

Castro has not commented as yet on the Eisenhower statement. In a radio-TV broadcast early to-

day, he referred only inferentially to differences between the United States and Cuba.

Castro's speech at an outdoor supper marking the 107th anniversary of the birth of Cuban patriot Jose Marti was in part a eulogy of Marti and in part an appeal to the Cuban people for independence and dignity.
