## Lar Daly To Run On Democratic Ticket

INDIANAPOLIS (UPI) — Irrepressible Lar Daly, the 48-year-old Chicagoan in the "Uncle Sam" suit, says he will run in Indiana's Democratic presidential preference primary May 3, if he must choose between the parties.

Daly originally had decided to enter both the Democratic and GOP primaries in this state. However, he chose the Democratic ticket after State Election Board chairman Edwin Steers ruled nobody may run in both primaries.

The statement of the "splinter candidate" came on the eve of another invasion of Indiana by a formidable Democratic presidential hopeful, Sen. John F. Kennedy, who will campaign in Lake and Vigo Counties, Thursday and Friday.

Daly said he will have no trouble in obtaining the 500 signatures required for his entry petition in the Hoosier primary and is confident he will run first "in a number of congressional districts."

Daly, who was born in Gary, recalled that he garnered more than 1,100 votes in the 1st District in 1956 when he ran against President Eisenhower in the GOP primary.

"The President beat me only about eight and a half to one in the 1st District that year," Daly said. "I'll have a fighting chance in several districts when I run in the Democratic primary."

Election officials in New Hampshire and Illinois are now endeavoring to prevent Daly from filing for president, but he said he will be on those ballots.

Daly said he also would attempt to be a presidential candidate in the primaries in Wisconsin, Maryland, West Virginia, Massachusetts, New Jersey, Oregon, Nebraska, California and the District of Columbia.

Daly was too late to combat in Ohio where today was the deadline. He also confessed defeat in trying to battle it out in South Dakota because of strict entrance requirements.

"Defend Christianity and American Interests" First, is Daly's campaign slogan.

He is a jobber in the sale of stools and chairs for churches, schools, poolrooms and taverns.

## South Bend Youth Is Victim Of Fire

SOUTH BEND, Ind. (UPI) — Three members of a family of four escaped a fire in their home today, but Fred Vaughn, 18, failed to get out and died from heat and smoke, police said.

Police said the fire apparently started in the living room, but the cause was undetermined.

The dead boy's mother, Phyllis, 45, suffered second and third degree burns and was taken to a hospital where she was listed in poor condition. The father, George, 47, suffered minor cuts on his arms and legs as he carried his wife out of the house. Another son, Phillip, 14, escaped injury.




