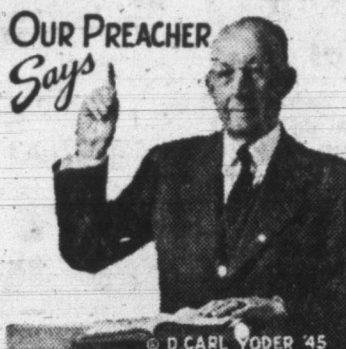
The church farthest south in the world has recently been dedicated by the United States Army Deep Freeze outpost in Antarctica. It is a 16-foot square chapel with a cross and a steeple above it. An inscription on the wall says, "Now it can be truly said that the earth turns on a point of faith."

The First Church of God, Texas, which had two Negro slaves on its charter membership when it was started 110 years ago, was named Rural Church of the Year by the Baptist General Convention of Texas, meeting at Corpus Christi.

Emphasize Responsibility for Freedom. Protestant and Eastern Orthodox churches in the U.S. will begin a year-long emphasis July 4 on Christian Responsibility for Freedom. The program will stress the obligation and right of Christians and churches to speak and act on public issues and Church-State relations in areas that affect the freedom of churches and religious and civil liberties of persons.

Gospel Recordings. Incorporated, has announced that since its founding 20 years ago over two million gospel records have been produced in 1,904 languages. Many have been sent out to tribes which are wholly illiterate but by means of the recordings and inexpensive phonographs they can hear the gospel preached and sung in their own native tongues. During 1958, records were produced in 67 new languages.

A new African Sunday school curriculum is being produced by 182 writers enlisted from 18 countries south of the Sahara in Africa. At the outset these lesson materials will appear in English, French and Portuguese. There are active plans to put them in 20 African languages or dialects which have top use in the continent. The curriculum is being prepared on a graded syllabus for five age groups. It is anticipated that the curriculum will be used by about 100 different church bodies in Africa.
