Plan Fund Raising Campaign For IFYE

Gail Hammond, Purdue University student from Decatur, is chairman for Adams county of a state-wide fund raising campaign to send five Indiana 4-H club members to foreign countries under the IFYE program. This campaign is sponsored by the Purdue collegiate 4-H club and by the Adams county extension office.

Under the international farm youth exchange program, five older youth from Indiana go to other countries where they actually work, play and live with foreign families. At the same time, similar young people from foreign countries are visiting in Indiana to learn about the way Hoosier farm families live.

Beulah Bertsch, from Decatur, was IFYE to Germany in 1952. The 1960 IFYE's are Elmer Harvey, Warick county, who goes to England-Wales; Martha Jo Lisk, Madison county, to Turkey; Dick Reed, LaGrange county, to Austria; Phil Mendal, Marion county, to Mexico; and Cynthia Bryant, Lake county, to Switzerland.

The following families of Adams county have been host families for inbound IFYE's: Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Koeman, William Griffith, William Kohne, Harold Miser.

Each year this IFYE program is financed by a campaign of this kind in the state from which the young people go. One-half of the \$3,000 cost is paid by the national 4-H foundation, and the other \$1,500 must be raised by contributions from Indiana people or organizations.

To date, Indiana has sent 34 IFYE's and has received 66 inbound IFYE's who have lived with 236 families.

Los Angeles Trial To Resume Tuesday

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — The final phase of the sensational murder trial of Dr. R. Bernard Finch and his young mistress Carole Tregoff opens Tuesday with attorneys presenting summations of nearly two months of often-conflicting testimony.

The handsome tennis-playing surgeon and his red-haired former receptionist might learn by the end of the week the decision of the jury of seven women and five men. Testimony ended last Thursday and the trial was recessed through today for the Washington birthday holiday.

Prosecutor Fred N. Whichello said he will ask for the death penalty for both Finch, 42, and Miss Tregoff, 23. They are accused of murder and conspiracy to murder Finch's estranged wife, Barbara Jean, 33, last July 18.

Seven Children Die In Fire In Ohio

OVERLIN, Ohio (UPI) — Seven young children, five of them from one family, burned to death Sunday night in a flash fire that ripped a single-story frame house here.

Firemen said a defective oil heater, which exploded, trapped the children in the rear three rooms.

Five of the children were those of Mr. and Mrs. James Isom. The others were those of Mrs. Mary Malone, who is Mrs. Isom's sister.

Firemen said the mothers were watching television in the front room when the blaze broke out. The mothers were taken to Allen Memorial Hospital here, where they were treated for shock.

The dead Isom children were Sheila, 8; Linda, 5; Dennis, 3; Marshelle, 18 months, and William, 6 months. The dead Malone children were Diane, 3, and Martin Jr., 2. Besides the mothers and their grandmother, Mrs. Sylvia Malone, two four-year-old boys, one from each family, escaped unharmed.

Mrs. Isom's husband, an Oberlin village employee, has been in jail since November for traffic manslaughter.

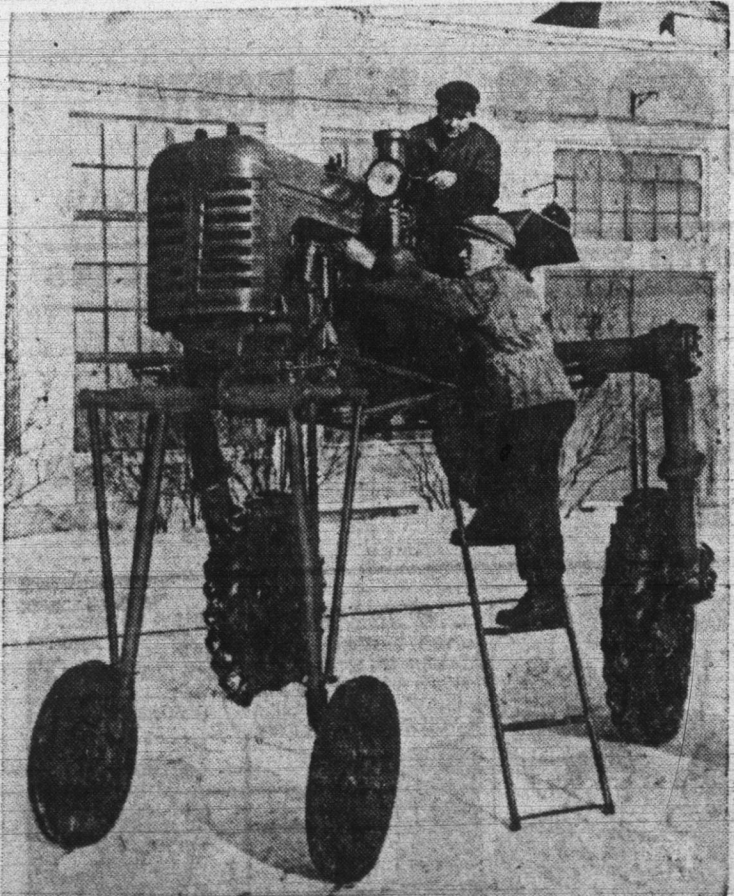
