Says Hoosier GOP Bankrupt Of Ideas

LOGANSPOUT, Ind. (UPI)—State Sen. Matthew Welsh said Wednesday night that the administration of Governor Handley "is bankrupt of ideas, of programs, and of energy to meet the needs of a growing Indiana."

Welsh, the leading contender for the Democratic gubernatorial nomination, told a United Steelworkers Union meeting that an "appalling lack of leadership" at the Statehouse and the "crumbling will" of the men charged with the responsibility for state government has kept Indiana on dead center in some things and made it slip behind in others.

"Progress is seen only in glowing reports designed to gloss over the real problems of a strong state caught with stagnant leadership," he said.

Welsh said his party does not have all the answers, "but we know and understand the needs of our state and we do strive actively and aggressively to meet them."

Welsh said the Handley administration issues a press release "that reports every man crossing the border with a tool kit in his hand as a new industry."

He said Indiana can meet its problems only if "we have active, aggressive leadership at every level of government... a leadership that understands the needs of Indiana and is willing and able to work with the people of the state in meeting those needs."

Berne Is Imperiled By Sewage Hazards

The city of Berne, and the area bordering on it as much as six miles downstream, is imperiled by the health hazard of raw and inadequately treated sewage, and the situation should be corrected "without further delay," the stream pollution control board has informed Berne city officials.

Feb. 8, Oral H. Hirt visited the Berne city council, and informed them of the necessity of proceeding with the construction of sewers and sewage treatment facilities.

Plans and specifications have been approved, but no further action has been taken by the local council. The sewage problem was a big issue in the last city election in Berne. The board advised the city that construction should be activated without further delay, or the matter would be referred to the board with the recommendation that a hearing be scheduled to consider the pollution of the Peter Habegger ditch, and tributaries thereto.

Student's Story Of Shooting Outlined

LAFAYETTE, Ind. (UPI)—Prentice Von Conrad's seven-month silence over how a fellow Purdue University student was shot to death in his garage apartment was broken by his attorney Wednesday.

Defense attorney Samuel Lehman outlined Von Conrad's story of the shooting of James Strain, 26, Westville, before a jury of 11 men and a woman in Tippecanoe Circuit Court. It was Lehman's opening statement before the prosecution of evidence begins in the manslaughter trial of Von Conrad, 38.

Lehman said Strain went to Von Conrad's apartment to drink beer and the two looked over Von Conrad's gun collection. He said Strain stepped outside the apartment and fired one gun and Von Conrad took it away from him.

Later, Lehman said, Von Conrad was showing Strain a revolver. He said Von Conrad unloaded the weapon and demonstrated how to fire it. Then, he said, Strain asked Von Conrad to pull the trigger again and the fatal shot was fired.

Prosecutor George Hanna's opening statement said the state would prove that even though Von

Conrad's act was involuntary and without malice, he intentionally pointed the weapon at Strain.

Fainbrush Treatment

Youths Reminded Of Draft Registration

A statement issued by Lt. Colonel Wayne E. Rhodes, state director of selective service, called the attention of all persons to the fact that the law requires each young man to register for the draft on his 18th birthday or within five days thereafter. Their duty to register is not excused by membership in any reserve component of the armed forces, including the national guard. The only excuse for not registering is if the man is actually on extended active duty in one of our armed forces, and then he must register within 30 days following his separation from active duty.

Col. Rhodes warned that failing to register as required by law is a violation of a federal statute and may result in fine and imprisonment. Failure to register may also result in summary induction before the normal time. If a young man is away from home when he becomes 18, he may register at the office of any local board of the selective service system in the United States. His records will then be forwarded to the local board at the place stated by him to be his permanent residence.
