March Roars Into Indiana Like Lion

The season's most severe cold front plunged temperatures as low as 13 degrees below zero in Indiana early today as March roared into Hoosierland like a lion. Record-shattering temperatures this late in the season were registered amid below-zero readings over much of the state. Wabash reported officially 13 below, the coldest there since December, 1958, when the mercury dropped to 19 below.

The coldest weather of the season tumbled temperatures to 7 below zero at Lafayette early today, 6 below at Goshen, and 4 below at Indianapolis, South Bend and Fort Wayne.

The low reading at Indianapolis at 6 a.m. broke the previous record low of 8 above for this date set in 1891 by 12 degrees.

Evansville, usually the mildest spot in Hoosierland, shivered in 5 above temperature.

The low at Indianapolis was seven degrees colder than the previous minimum reading there this season—last Saturday. And it marked the first time this season that temperatures generally throughout the northern and central portions skidded below zero.

A slight warm-up as the result of mostly sunny weather was predicted for today, with afternoon highs ranging from the mid-20s north to the upper 20s downstate, and lows tonight from 5 above to 15.

Somewhat warmer was predicted for Wednesday, and the outlook for Thursday was cloudy with snow and snow mixed with freezing rain or sleet south and a "little warmer."

South Bend still measured 8 inches of snow on the ground this morning, Lafayette and Bunker Hill 7 inches, Goshen 6, Fort Wayne and Indianapolis 5.

Negroes' Right Of Voting Is Historic Issue

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The basic issue behind the Senate's historic around-the-clock civil rights debate is the right of Negroes in the South to vote.

Republicans and Northern Democrats both want credit for federal action to insure wider Negro suffrage in this presidential election year.

But many civil rights advocates from big Northern states want to go much further. On the other hand, many moderates are willing to settle for some kind of voting rights bill.

A hard core Southern bloc is fighting all proposals on grounds that they violate state sovereignty and that present federal laws are adequate.

Officially before the Senate is President Eisenhower's rights program, offered by Senate Republican Leader Everett M. Dirksen (Ill.) as a substitute amendment affecting a Stetson, Mo., school district.

More than 200 proposals—Bills, resolutions, amendments, etc.—pertaining at least vaguely to civil rights have been introduced last year and this. Most of them could be offered as amendments to the Stetson bill unless the Senate voted to cut off debate by imposing its rarely used cloture rule.

The Eisenhower proposal would: —Make use of force or threats to obstruct court ordered school desegregation a federal offense.

—Permit federal officers to cross state lines for arrests in "hate" bombings of schools, churches, etc.

—Empower the attorney general to inspect local voting records in federal elections and require that the records be preserved for a "reasonable period."

—Provide for temporary financial and technical aid to localities trying to integrate schools.

—Provide education for children of military personnel when their public schools are closed because of integration disputes.

—Extend the federal Civil Rights Commission until 1961. (Congress already did this last year.)

—Make the President's committee on equal job opportunity under government contracts a permanent organization. It is headed by Vice President Richard M. Nixon.

—Establish federal voting referees to insure Negro suffrage.

Chilean Officials Warning On Visit

SANTIAGO, Chile (UPI)—Chilean officials warned today that the so far vastly successful visit of President Eisenhower might backfire if the citizens of this inflation-plagued country are led to expect too much.

There was some concern here that Eisenhower might not fully realize the significance attributed to some of his remarks to President Jorge Alessandri Rodriguez—particularly regarding removal or reduction of the U. S. import tax on copper.

Alessandri said Monday Eisenhower had promised to "study the possibility" of eliminating the tax of 1.7 cents per pound and that the United States has no intention of dumping surplus copper on the world market.

The officials said that in general terms Eisenhower struck the right chord when he promised Alessandri in their talks that Chile's sentiments will be fully considered as the United States prepares its position for the May summit meeting with Russia.

Chileans also applauded his strong pledges of support for hemispheric solidarity and greater cooperation to eliminate some of the Latin American economic ills. This feeling was reflected in the surprisingly warm welcome given Eisenhower by hundreds of thousands who ignored left wing charges his visit was part of an imperialist plot.

Chilean Foreign Minister German Vergara Donoso appeared to sum up the general feeling when he said Eisenhower showed that the "United States is coming to occupy a seat in the American family and is no more the old, rich and distant uncle."

Indiana Woman Is Killed In Michigan

THREE RIVERS, Mich. (UPI)—An Indiana woman was one of four persons killed late Monday in a two-car head-on collision near here.

Police said a car carrying four women to work apparently veered into the path of the other vehicle while trying to pass another car. Killed were Sherman King, 33; his wife, Ethel, 50, both of Frederic, Wis.; King's mother, Mrs. Nora King, 78, North Manchester, Ind.; and Mrs. Ronald Tarrant, 24, White Pigeon, Mich.

Officers said the Kings apparently were taking King's mother home after a visit in Frederic. King was driving one of the cars. The other was driven by Mrs. Earl Ford, 24, White Pigeon. Mrs. Ford, who is pregnant, and her two passengers, Mrs. Mildred Deckard, 30, and Mrs. Shirley Deisler, 31, were rushed to Three Rivers Hospital.
