Sales At Record

CHICAGO, Ill.—Another record high period for sales was reported by the National Tea Co. today, when H. V. McNamara, president, announced that sales for the company's second four week accounting period were again the highest on record for any like reporting period in the company's history.

National Tea Co. consolidated sales for the four week period ending February 27, reached \$64,000,788 for an increase of \$1,500,603, which amounts to a gain of 2.4 per cent over 1959, when the company's sales were \$62,500,185.

CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL

Owners of taxable real estate in the consolidated school corporation known as the Adams County Central Consolidated School, which includes all of the territory within the corporate limits of Adams County Central Consolidated School, which prior to consolidation, made up of Kirkland School Township, Monroe School Township, and Washington School Township of Adams County, Indiana, are hereby notified that a consolidated school corporation has been filed by more than fifty owners of taxable real estate in said consolidated school corporation for the purpose of procuring funds to be used and need of which is to be used for the construction and equipment of an addition to and the repair, alteration and remodeling of existing school buildings of the consolidated school corporation. A demonstration against the issuance of said bonds may be filed with the School Board by owners of taxable real estate in said consolidated school corporation in the manner and within the time provided by Sec. 64-313 Burns Statutes of Indiana. Owners of taxable real estate in the consolidated school corporation are further notified that School Board, did on the 8th day of March, 1960, adopt a resolution authorizing the issuance of and sale of bonds of the consolidated school corporation in the amount of sixty-two thousand dollars (\$62,000.00) for the purpose of procuring funds to be used as above stated. Said bonds are to bear interest at a rate not exceeding 4% per annum (the exact rate to be determined by bidding), and are to be payable over a period of approximately five years. Applications may be made by ten or more taxpayers filing a petition in the office of the Auditor, Adams County, to consolidate and manner provided by law.

The net assessed valuation of taxable property in the consolidated school corporation, shown by the assessment made for State and County taxes in the year 1959 is \$9,169,140.00, and the net assessed valuation of the consolidated school corporation, exclusive of the above mentioned bonds is \$12,000.00.

The proposed addition to existing buildings will be constructed on the school grounds in the Town of Monroe, Adams County, Indiana, immediately to the north of the east unit of the existing buildings.

Tentative plans call for an addition with overall dimensions of 100' x 80' containing 12 (12) elementary classrooms and toilet rooms.

The estimated cost of construction and equipment of said addition is eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000.00).
