A Great American

Today is the birthday of one of the greatest American presidents, military and political leaders—Andrew Jackson, the seventh president of the United States.

President Jackson was born on March 15, 1767, 193 years ago, in the Waxhaw settlement on the North and South Carolina border.

Although Jackson had little refined education, he entered a law office at the age of 17, and began the reading of law. At the age of 18 he was admitted to the bar at Salisbury, North Carolina. The following year he left for Nashville, Tenn., where he entered the legal profession.

A member of the convention which drafted the constitution for the state of Tennessee; in 1796 he was chosen a representative in Congress, and in 1797 he became a U.S. Senator. The next year he resigned to become a judge of the supreme court of Tennessee, at the age of 31.

In 1812, when the United States declared war against England, Jackson offered his services with 2,500 volunteers, and was ordered to New Orleans. Later he led U.S. troops against the Creek Indians in Georgia and Alabama, and defeated them at Horseshoe Bend. On May 31, 1815 he was appointed a major general in the regular army, and put in command of the department of the south.

His courageous defense of New Orleans, where 6,000 men, inspired with bravery and courage from their leader, held out and defeated 12,000 veteran British troops under Gen. Pakenham, made him a national hero.

In 1824, Jackson was a candidate for president, and he received the most electoral votes, 99, and a plurality of the popular vote. However, he did not have a majority of the electoral vote, so the election was thrown to the house of representatives. Clay threw his 41 votes to Adams, who had 84, and was later appointed secretary of state by President Adams. This led to charges of a "corrupt bargain," and in 1828 Jackson soundly defeated Adams in the election.

Jackson, with Thomas Jefferson, takes a place among the great leaders who helped shape the destiny of the United States.

Notre Dame Grads
To Hear Eisenhower

SOUTH BEND, Ind. (UPI)—President Eisenhower has accepted an invitation to deliver the commencement address at the University of Notre Dame's 115th annual commencement exercises June 5. It was announced late Monday.

The Rev. Theodore Hesburgh, Notre Dame president, said that Eisenhower also will receive an honorary degree at the commencement.

Father Hesburgh said that details of additional honorary degree recipients and the President's visit to South Bend will be announced later.

Eisenhower will be the second American president to be given an honorary degree from Notre Dame. Franklin D. Roosevelt was honored at a special convocation in 1935 celebrating the independence of the Philippines.

The invitation was accepted in a White House letter dated March 9 and received on the campus Monday. The White House and Notre Dame announced the acceptance simultaneously.

Eisenhower visited Notre Dame on Sept. 15, 1952, during his first presidential campaign. Father Hesburgh has been close to the Eisenhower administration. He has held three presidential appointments. He is a member of the Commission on Civil Rights and the National Science Board. He formerly served as a member and president of the board of visitors at the U.S. Naval Academy.

DRUG STOREArguments Continue
On Smoking, Cancer

The hullabaloo about correlating lung cancer, the leading cause of cancer deaths for men, and smoking has been hashed about for a couple of years now with little conclusive evidence submitted in support of arguments pro or con.

The American Cancer society recently released all the known facts and figures on the subject, and this article will enable Adams county residents to see for themselves whether or not a correlation exists.

The Main Facts

1. At least 23 studies in eight countries have shown that lung cancer patients are predominantly cigarette smokers.

2. No evidence of any kind has ever been produced that is inconsistent with the generally held view that excessive cigarette smoking is one of the principal causes of lung cancer.

3. The ACS's own study of 44 months on smoking habits and the fate of 187,783 men from 50 to 70 years old is as follows: A. Death from all causes combined rises the number of cigarettes smoked daily. Rates were doubled for those who smoked two or more packs a day compared with non-smokers. B. Men who stopped smoking had death rates lower than those who continued to smoke. C. Lung cancer death rates were 10 times as high as men who had never smoked. D. Coronary death rates for smokers ranged from nearly two and a half times higher for two-pack a day smokers than for non-smokers. E. Deaths from lung disease other than cancer were nearly three times as high as the rates for non-smokers. F. Deaths from cancers of the mouth, esophagus, tongue, and larynx among smokers were more than five times as high than for non-smokers.

Public Health Statement

seven leading American scientists has reviewed all available evidence and concluded: "The sum total of scientific evidence establishes beyond reasonable doubt that cigarette smoking is a causative factor in the rapidly increasing incidence of human epidermoid carcinoma (cancer of the lung)." The group was organized by the ACS, the American heart association, and their federal counterparts, the national cancer institute and the national heart institute.

The British government has launched an educational campaign warning of the hazards of cigarette smoking. The action is based on a report by its medical research council that the relationship between cigarette smoking and lung cancer was "one of direct cause and effect."

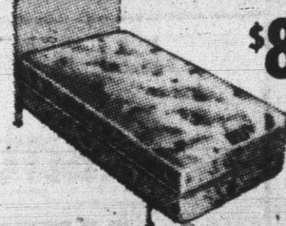
