Bloomington's Panthers Have Only One Loss

INDIANAPOLIS (UPI)—Bloomington may be in Indiana's high school basketball tourney finals a year later than its most ardent backers had hoped, but coach Keith Rhoades isn't complaining.

"We had a good team last year, too," he said, when illness sidelined his two top performers, Mickey Reeves and Dick Sparks. "We were 11-3 when Reeves became ill and ended up 12-10 for the season."

Bloomington never got past the sectional round last year, however, and made a fresh start last fall.

It didn't take long for the Panthers to claim state-wide ranking. Only Jasper was able to beat them, and the fifth-rated team in the state checks in with a sparkling 26-1 record Saturday against Muncie Central (27-0) in the opener of the state finals.

TV Sports Picture Is Revealed By ABC

NEW YORK (UPI)—The TV menu for America's sports fans will be the same but the time and the channel will be different.

That sums up the new TV sports picture produced Wednesday when the American Broadcasting Co. revealed an \$8,500,000 deal involving the regular weekend fights, major league baseball and college football.

The new arrangement means:

1. Boxing fans will see their "regular" weekend fight telecasts over ABC on Saturday nights instead of over NBC on Friday nights. The first of the ABC Saturday night fights will be televised on Oct. 8.

2. ABC will present major league baseball "live" on Saturdays, beginning April 16, at 4 p.m., est. The series will run for
