# Grand Duchess Of Russia Is Dead

LONDON (UPI) — Intrigue, wealth, murder, and royalty were threads running through the life of Grand Duchess Xenia of Russia.

When she was six, in 1881, terrorists assassinated her grandfather, Czar Alexander II, by blowing up his sled on a snowy street in St. Petersburg.

In 1888, her father, Czar Alexander III, saved her life when revolutionaries dynamited the royal train. He used his enormous strength to hold up the shattered roof of their carriage until rescue came.

**Drowns Rasputin**  
Her son-in-law, Prince Yussouppoff, helped shoot and drown Gregory Rasputin, the "mad monk" who held a sinister influence over the Czarina of Russia, Xenia's sister-in-law.

The fabulous rule of the Romanovs ended in murder in 1918. Her brother, Czar Nicholas II, and his family were shot to death by the Bolsheviks who had overthrown his government.

Grand Duchess Xenia escaped the Bolsheviks aboard a British battleship sent to Yalta during the revolution by her cousin, King George V of England.

She lived in exile 43 years, far from the continuing march of bloody events in Russia, and died of pneumonia Wednesday at the age of 85 in a quiet English suburban home.

**Received Few Visitors**  
The grand duchess was married to Grand Duke Alexander Michailovich, an admiral of the Russian fleet and founder of the Russian air force. They fled together to France and England. He died in 1933, leaving six sons and a daughter.

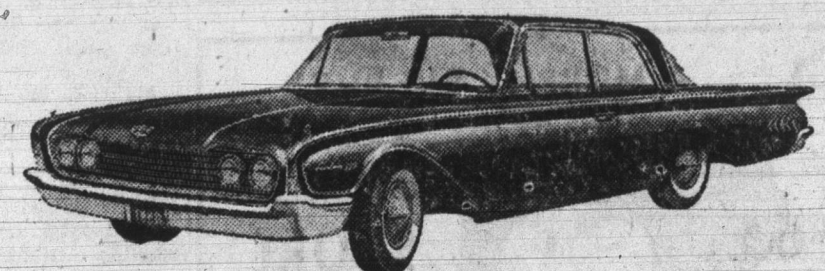

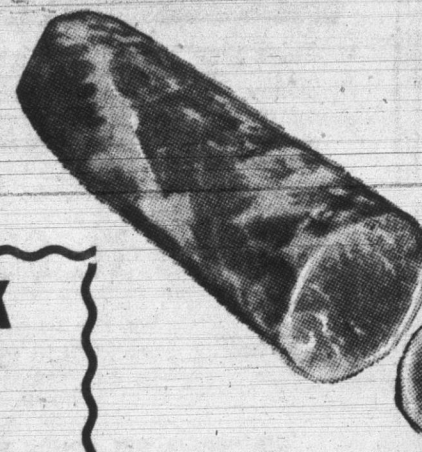
