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## Will It Count?

Within the next two weeks Decatur residents will take part in two very important elections. In the first, they will decide if they are going to sell the city light plant for \$2,099,300, or not.

In the second, city and county voters will choose the nominees for the party of their choice.

Voting is as simple as making an X. That's all there is to it.

But if you want to make sure that your vote counts, place your X within the square on the power ballots, and between the lines on the primary ballots.

Do not trace over the lines—it will probably invalidate your ballot. Just place a small line within the square and draw another through it. Do not make any extra marks on the ballot.

Some people in the past have marked "Yes" beside each name. This ballot cannot be counted. Others have allowed the lines to go outside the square or circle. These are not counted. Others try to straighten out the lines, and put hooks or spurs on them, invalidating their vote.

It doesn't matter if the lines are crooked. It does matter if the line is retraced, or has a hook or spur on the end or sides.

If you make a mistake on your ballot, don't feel ashamed to ask for a new ballot—just tell the inspector that you have mutilated yours.

If you mark the wrong square, don't mark through it — ask for a new ballot. Otherwise you may lose all your votes.

## Lutheran Pastor To Duties As Chaplain

The Rev. Richard C. Ludwig, pastor of Zion Lutheran church, will begin his annual two week tour of duty as a chaplain in the United States Air Force reserves next Monday and has been assigned to the 818th combat support group, strategic air command, Lincoln Air Force base at Lincoln, Nebr. Lt. Ludwig is attached to the 9669 air reserve squadron in Fort Wayne during the year. Chaplains in the Air Force conduct their activities under a six-point program which includes worship, religious education, personal counseling, humanitarian services, cultural activities, and public relations. Last year, Chaplain Ludwig spent his two weeks of active duty at Bunker Hill air base at Peru. While Rev. Ludwig is at Lincoln, his wife and children will visit the pastor's sister and her family, who live in northern Kansas. The Rev. Harold Maleske, professor of Concordia Senior College at Ft. Wayne, will conduct both services and teach the adult Bible class at Zion Lutheran church April 24 and May 1 during Rev. Ludwig's absence.
