
Purdue Group Visits Two Local Industries

Registration Opened To Girl Scout Camp

Registration for Timberlost Girl Scout Camp Ella J. Logan opened Monday, it was announced by Mrs. Clarence Carlson, chairman of the Camp Logan committee. All registered Girl Scouts have received camp folders with detailed information and registration forms.

concerning Camp Logan.

The fee for Camp Logan is \$35 per session with an additional \$7.50 fee for out-of-council campers. The program is based upon Girl Scout program fundamentals, including camping skills, nature, dramatics, music, crafts, games, outdoor cooking, and skills in living together. The campers will take canoe trips on Lake Wawasee, Lake Tippecanoe and the Barbee chain of lakes, and on the Elkhart and Tippecanoe rivers.

The camp is located on Dewart

Lake, near Syracuse, and there will be four sessions of camp: June 27-July 8; July 11-July 22; July 25-Aug. 5; and Aug. 8-Aug. 19. Timberlost council is made up of six counties: Adams, Allen, DeKalb, Huntington, Steuben and Wells. All Intermediate and Senior Girl Scouts in these counties, including girls who will enter the fifth grade in the fall, are eligible to attend. Girls who were members of troops that have disbanded within the last year may also attend.

A counselor-in-training unit designed for those girls who wish to prepare for future counselor experience, is offered. It presents an opportunity to practice leadership, group work and programming, combined with the fun of special interests. Applicants must be 16 years of age or entering their junior year in high school. There are two sessions: June 27-July 22, and July 25-August 19. The cost is \$48 per session.
