

13 County Students Honored At I.U.

Thirteen Adams county residents were honored for scholastic achievement at Indiana University's annual "founders' day" convocation at 10 a.m. today.

The traditional occasion marked the 140th anniversary of the creation of the Hoosier state university by an act of the Indiana general assembly.

President Herman B. Wells presided over the convocation at which Ralph L. Collins, dean of faculties, spoke. Students whose grades won them mention on the dean's list of the various schools and membership in scholastic societies were introduced by John W. Ashton, dean of the graduate school.

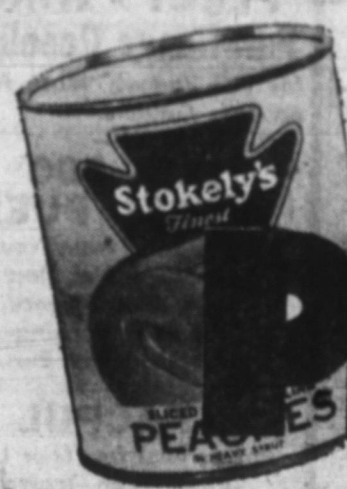

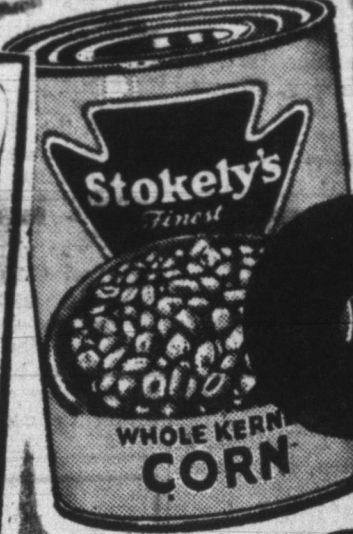
