Handley Keeps Firm Hold On Indiana GOP

INDIANAPOLIS (UPI)—The Statehouse forces of Governor Handley retained firm control of the Indiana Republican Party today.

Handley's hand-picked choice for GOP state chairman, Edwin W. Beaman, was reelected unanimously Wednesday to another term at a party reorganization meeting. Reelected along with Beaman were Mrs. Martha Whitehead, Waldron, vice chairman; George Stark, Indianapolis, treasurer, and James T. Neal, Noblesville, secretary.

About the only surprise to come out of the closed meeting was the reelection of Mrs. Lona E. Harrington, Chesterton, as Indiana's national Republican committeewoman.

Mrs. Harrington and national committeeman Ralph F. Gates, Columbia City, were unanimously named to new four-year terms when the 22-member GOP State Central Committee suspended a rule which provides that the officers be filled after the Republican state convention in June.

The decision to rename Mrs. Harrington to another term was interpreted as a slap at Rep. Charles A. Halleck, Rensselaer. Halleck, House minority leader and dean of Indiana congressmen, was believed behind the successful move to oust Mrs. Harrington as 2nd District vice chairman in Tuesday's district reorganization meeting.

Halleck Maneuver Mrs. Harrington said Tuesday her defeat as vice chairman came because she was a "conservative" and said she was a victim of Halleck's "wrath."

Her ouster was sanctioned by former GOP state chairman Alvin C. Cast, Kentland, who was reelected 2nd District chairman. Cast, a close friend of Halleck, apparently realized he did not have the strength to defeat Mrs. Harrington's bid for another term as national committeewoman and joined in her endorsement.

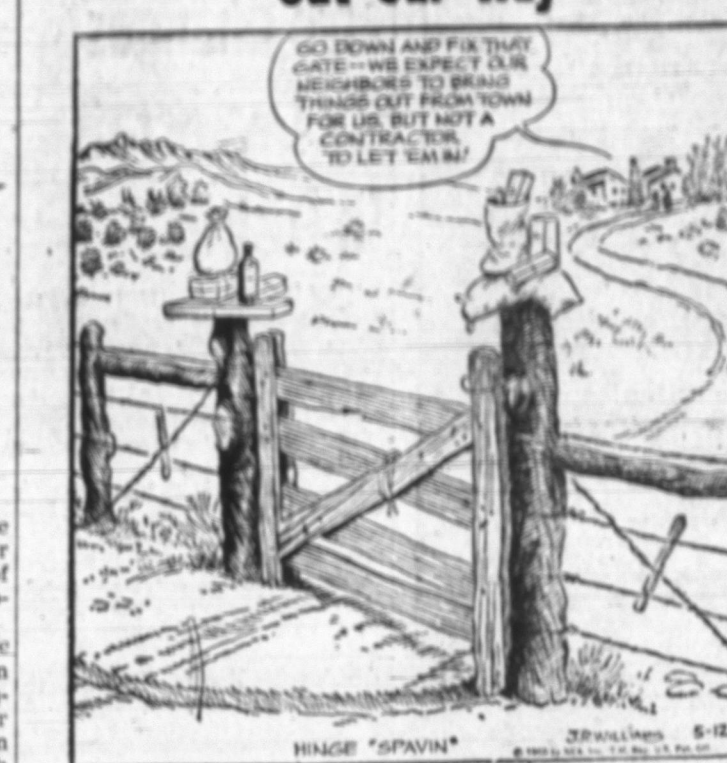
Handley's hold on the party organization was demonstrated when Beaman and the other state committee officers were reelected without a dissenting vote "only minutes after the committee went into executive session."

Mrs. Dorothy McCrea, 7th District vice chairman, then moved that the rules be suspended to permit election of a national committeewoman and committee chairman Ray O. Myers, Richmond, and 4th District chairman Thomas A. Galmeyer, Fort Wayne, nominated former Gov. Gates. Both were reelected without opposition.

Handley Attends Meeting Mrs. Harrington is a close friend of Lt. Gov. Crawford. F. Parker, New Castle, the lone candidate to succeed Handley as chief executive. Cast was state Republican chairman under former Gov. George N. Craig, Parker's political enemy.

Cast reaffirmed his decision to seek nomination for lieutenant governor, but implied that there might be some truth to rumors

that he would oppose Parker for the top spot on the party ticket.

"I have already paid my \$1,000 convention fee as a candidate for lieutenant governor," Cast said. "I have nothing against Parker."

If I did, I wouldn't be trying to gain the nomination to run on the ticket with him."

But Cast said he had "not made up my mind for sure."

Handley arrived from a visit to New York in time to attend the meeting. He walked into the room to a standing round of applause and later told the chairmen and vice chairmen they "must now work together to insure a Republican victory in November."

Russia Has 40-Year Record Of Spying on Uncle Sam

WASHINGTON—(NEA)—All the excitement over Russia's capture of its first American spy is being weighed here against the far-greater 40-year record of Soviet espionage in the United States.

RUSSIAN ESPIONAGE AGAINST THE UNITED STATES began in 1919 when Ludwig Martens became the first official Soviet representative in the U.S.

He was deported for spying in 1921 along with one of his clerks, Arthur Alexandrovich Adams, who got back in the U.S. later and headed up prewar spy rings here.

Soviet espionage against the United States did not stop even when the two countries were allies in World War II. It got worse.

This was documented best by Victor A. Kravchenko, an engineer in the U.S.S.R. lead-lease mission in Washington. In 1944 he got fed up with the Russian way of life, sought asylum in the United States and wrote a book, "I Chose Freedom." It is a complete indictment of how the entire Russian Embassy staff is used to spy on America.

At least a score of Russian diplomats, military attaches and U.N. officials have been caught spying in America.

The only Russian agent who has ever come close to receiving a death sentence for espionage in the U.S. is Jack Soble. Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, executed in 1953, were Americans spying for Russia.

A charge of transmitting national defense information to Russia was dropped when Soble pleaded guilty to a second count of conspiring to obtain vital U.S. information. He was sentenced to seven years' imprisonment in 1957.

THE HIGHEST-RANKING SOVIET SPY caught in this country is Col. Rudolf Ivanovich Abel, picked up on a routine immigration check in 1957. For nine years he operated a spy ring from the cover of a Brooklyn photo studio.

He was tried, found guilty and sentenced to 30 years' imprisonment. During his trial the Soviet Union did not lift a finger to defend him.

THE UNITED STATES HAS ADMITTED that pilot Francis G. Powers was on an intelligence-gathering mission when his plane was shot down over Russia. Instead of disowning him, the U.S. government will try to save him if he is brought to trial.

The wave of criticism against State Department, Central Intelligence Agency, Air Force and even the President is based on a charge of bungling in this case.

IT DOES INVOLVE SOME BAD BREAKS. The plane should have destroyed itself on being hit by the Russian missile—blowing itself to bits beyond identification.

In the best traditions of spy thrillers, Powers would have destroyed himself, rather than submit to capture. But this script wasn't followed. The fat's in the fire.

Body Of Drowning Victim Recovered

WALKERTON, Ind. (UPI)—The body of Guy Olson, 52, Mill Creek, was recovered from the Kankakee River near here Wednesday, four days after a boat capsized and threw him into the water.

Authorities said Olson fell into the river about four miles west of here while returning from a mushroom hunting expedition with two companions last Sunday.

Hartford City Man Killed In Accident

MUNCIE, Ind. (UPI)—Vernard Chester Elliot, 46, Hartford City, was killed Wednesday night when he turned his car into the path of a five-truck north of here.

Zack Williams Jr., 37, Plateau, Ala., driver of the truck, was hurt and taken to Ball Memorial Hospital here.
